TEACH THEM ABOUT COTTON

TECHNICAL TRAINING FREE OF CHARGE AT A. & M. COLLEGE AT STILLWATER.

Stillwater, Okla., July 10.—The new cotton grading for farmers and buyers and the special information obtained in technical training pays. The cotton growers realize this and the cotton buyers have known it for a number of years, but only recently have special cotton schools been organized.

The Agricultural & Mechanical College at Stillwater held the first of these schools in Oklahoma last year and it was a success.

The college management will open another cotton grading school on July 12th. Farmers and cotton buyers, who are interested, may gain most valuable information by attending the work given under the supervision of Mr. T. A. Robinson.

During the mid-summer, the college authorities have cotton constructed, which are to be used free of cost by those who wish and some of the large college buildings will be occupied as sleeping quarters.

The most noted cotton experts of the south and some of the government specialists assist in the course. The work will begin Monday, July 12th. A second class will begin the work July 26th and close August 7th.

Students interested may enter at any time during the course. All instruction is free. President J. H. Connell at Stillwater will send valuable information on request.
