Those who were fortunate enough to have visited Lorena park yesterday afternoon, had the privilege of seeing one of the finest games of the season and had it not been for the action of the Tish team near the middle of the game, the game would have ranked with the top notchers.

In the sixth inning, the Tish players became dissatisfied with the umpire, an Oklahoma Cityan and a neutral one at that, and they were the first to sanction him for the position, but so determined were they to win from Armore, by any sort of means, and believing they were getting the worst of it, threw up their jobs like babies and walked off the field. They were finally persuaded to come back and play the game out and give the crowd their money's worth, after a change of umpire had been agreed upon. In the seventh, the Tish boys play a clean and gentlemanly game, but they certainly tried the baby act yesterday.

Not a score was made until the fourth inning, when each side drew one, and in the sixth the Blues had a batting rally and landed six safe ones, following with another in the seventh. The Tish team made one in the fourth and one in the eighth. Baum held the batting honors for the Blues with a two-bagger to his credit. Tish changed pitchers during the game but were unable to get a man past home but twice. While seven of their men were struck out by Nichols, who was at his best again and played a fine game, Nick is hard to get rattled and it is to his credit that he takes little part in disputes and simply plays the game. FEDERAL LIQUOR LICENSE MATTER

Washington, Aug. 15.—Treasury department officials say that Governor Haskell of Oklahoma will not get far with his protest to President Taft against the issuance of federal liquor licenses in Oklahoma. The internal revenue office had told the governor that he had no right to interfere with the federal liquor license law by issuing federal liquor licenses, and demanding that the resident issue an order prohibiting the treasury department from issuing such licenses in states where the sale of liquor is forbidden. Internal revenue Commissioner Caper being out of the city, one of his assistants had this to say in reference to the Haskell request: "We received and refused a similar request from South Dakota a few months ago. The law is plain; we issue a federal liquor tax receipt to any one who applies and pays the amount fixed by statute for selling liquor. It is not license to do business, but an evidence that the federal liquor tax has been complied with. It does not give immunity to any man who undertakes to sell liquor in a state or section where the sale of liquor is prohibited. Instead of being an aid to violators, it ought to be an aid to the Oklahoma state officials in enforcing their law, in that it furnishes them a clue as to who is probably selling liquor in the state. We do not look for any instructions to refuse to issue such licenses in Oklahoma or elsewhere until the federal law is changed."
