# THE TRUE LOVE APOSTLE DEAD

MOSES HARMON BEGAN HIS PROPAGANDA IN VALLEY FALLS, KAN., THIRTY YEARS AGO.

## BODY IS TO BE CREMATED

Published a Paper to Advocate His Method of Emancipating Women, and Twice His Writings Got Him Into Prison.

Chicago, Feb. 2.—Moses Harmon, the Kansas apostle of free love, who published his paper, *Harmon*, in Chicago for several years after it became too hot for him in Kansas, died Sunday night in Los Angeles, Cal. He established his free love paper in Valley Falls, Kan., thirty years ago.

Harmon was a persistent advocate of the abolition of institutional marriage, which, he contended, made slaves of women. His fidelity to what he regarded as the sacred right of free expression caused him to be sent to the federal penitentiary twice on conviction of sending improper literature through the mails. He was 80 years old.

In his will Harmon requested that his body be kept at least three days after death and that a dagger should then be driven through his heart to prevent the possibility of his being buried alive, will not be carried out.

"If father made any such request in his will I know nothing of it," said his daughter, Lillian Harmon, yesterday at her residence here. "At any rate I have telegraphed to Los Angeles to have the body embalmed and will start for that city tonight."

"Will he be buried without a coffin, as he requested?" she was asked.

"I believe the body will be cremated. His only opposition to a coffin was his desire to have his body return to its original elements as soon as possible. He believed in cremation and his will was written long before cremation became common."

"Oh, I am sure father had too much regard for the feelings of others to make such a request."

Moses Harmon's free love ideas were shared in by his daughter, Lillian, who was married to E. C. Walker, a New York according to the ideas advocated by her father. The ceremony advocated by Harmon consisted simply of the man and woman joining hands and repeating to each other:

I agree to live with you in the holy bonds of matrimony so long as love doth last, but no longer.

Harmon was first sent to prison in 1895 for ten months. Ten years later he was again arrested and convicted for sending objectionable matter through the mail. After his release he came to Kansas City and was given a reception at the home of Dr. L. M. Hammond, 415 College Avenue, Rosedale. Harmon's right in life, was as he believed, for the exaltation and the emancipation of woman. In an interview given recently, he said:

"I was an abolitionist and advocated the freeing of the negroes. I am still an abolitionist with the difference that I am now fighting for the emancipation of women. I believe in a woman owning her own soul. I regard the marriage vow that is now required by law an immoral promise.

"I do not object to formal marriages but I do say that when a man and woman cease to love each other they should not be required to live with each other for the mere sake of appearance. The marriage vow which I advocate puts people on their good behavior and does not compel a woman to suffer all kinds of indignities from an overbearing man.

"Under my teachings a woman is exalted and is permitted to regard herself as a human individual and not merely as the annex of some man. She is not given away in marriage as under the old law and man is not the peer of woman according to the new philosophy."
