MISSING BELIEVED TO BE DEAD NOW

NO HOPE ENTERTAINED THAT SIXTY-SEVEN, LISTED MISSING, ARE STILL ALIVE.

BURIED FORTY-EIGHT HOURS

Improbable that any Persons Could Survive Exposure for that Length of Time—Portions of Bodies Being Found.

Everett, Wash., March 2.—Few believe that any of the sixty-seven persons, listed as missing, will be found alive, for it is now more than 48 hours since they were buried beneath tons of snow and ice and the twisted wreckage of the Great Northern train which were swept to the bottom of the canyon.

The exact number of dead will not be known for weeks, or not until the snow, more than forty feet deep in the canyon, has melted.

Workmen, digging in the snow and wreckage, report the finding of dismembered bodies, several arms and hands. Frequently the first indication that they were digging near a body, comes, when they uncover a large patch of blood red snow.

Detroit, Mich., March 3.—Dr. Geo. A. Felch was today found guilty of manslaughter in connection with the death last summer of Maybelle Millman, whose dismembered body was found in a creek near here.

TOWN OF O'KEENE WAS FIRE SWEEPED

Enid, Okla., March 3.—Fire, believed to have been of incendiary origin, destroyed the greater part of the town of O'Keene, near here today. The fire started in the post-office building.

DALLAS CROWD LYNCHED NEGRO

ALLEN BROOKS SWUNG UP FROM ELKS ARCH, CORNER MAIN AND AKARD STREETS.

MOB DOES WORK QUIETLY

Mob Rushed into the Court House, Seized Negro and Threw Him Out of Window to Comrades Before Officers Could Offer Resistance.

Dallas, Texas, March 3.—After he had been hidden in the jury room and a report had been circulated that a change of venue would be granted to Allen Brooks, a negro 38 years old, he was seized by a mob, which forced an entrance to the court house, sweeping police and deputies aside. Allen was hurled through a window on the second floor, with a rope around his neck. The crowd outside seized the rope and dragged the negro through the streets to the Elks arch, in the heart of the business section, where the body was strung up. The body was cut down at 11:30 o'clock.

All saloons in Dallas were closed following the lynching.

Brooks was charged with criminal assault on Mary Blayven, a white girl 2½ years of age. He was arrested shortly after the crime was committed and, fearing mob violence, the prisoner was hurried off to Sherman and placed in the Grayson county jail. He remained there until this morning, when he was brought back for trial.

The mob organized quietly near the court house, half the number rushing upstairs to the court room and securing Brooks, while the other members waited anxiously below. Soon the negro was thrown out the window and the rope around his neck was seized by the members of the mob. The procession down Main street was indeed a weird one.

Later the mob went to the jail and attempted to secure another negro prisoner, but the officers had learned of the mob's intentions and rushed him to Fort Worth.

Dallas, Texas, March 3.—The mob which lynched Allen Brooks, the negro rapist, today numbered 3,000 men.
It is reported at 3:30 this afternoon that a large mob has left Dallas for Fort Worth to storm the Tarrant county jail there and secure the negro murderer who was removed to Fort Worth this morning for safe keeping, following the lynching of Brooks.

FLOODS THREATEN THE INLAND EMPIRE

FLOOD DISTRICTS FROM WASHINGTON COUNTIES ON EAST AS FAR AS MONTANA.

Spokane, Wash., March 3.—Almost unprecedented flood conditions are reported in the valleys of the "inland empire," especially on the eastern slope of the Cascades and from the eastern tier of Washington counties into and including Montana.
While the situation has improved in the Couer d'Alene, there is yet danger on all sides, as the weather is now balmy and the streams are unable to carry off the enormous masses of water caused by the sudden melting of the great quantities of snow.

Elberton, in Whitman county, is in danger and the citizens are resorting to the use of dynamite. Lewiston, Idaho, is cut off by rail and Pomeroy has had no trains for several days. The big irrigation dams at Shoshone and Minner are in grave danger. The greatest damage so far has been to irrigation works, especially those under construction.

COMMISSION WANT RAILROAD OFFICIALS

SIXTEEN PROMINENT RAILROAD OFFICIALS SUMMONED BY STATE CORPORATION COMMISSION.

Guthrie, Okla., March 3.—Sixteen railway officials, including several of the most prominent in the United States, are to be served with a subpoena, issued today by the corporation commissioners of the state of Oklahoma, demanding their presence in Guthrie March 15 as witnesses in the freight rate investigation, now in progress here.
The list includes President Gould of the Iron Mountain; President Edson, Kansas City Southern; President Ripley, Santa Fe; President Winchell, the Frisco; President Mudge, Rock Island; President Kell, Wichita Falls & Northwestern, and President Allen of the Katy.

The state wants to get at the valuation of properties in Oklahoma to refute the findings, forming the basis for the recent injunction issued by Judge Hooks, restraining the commission from enforcing the freight rates.

CRUSHING DEFEAT INSURGENT CAUSE

CHAMORRO'S ARMY WIPED OUT, THE GENERAL AND ONLY A FEW ESCAPING ALIVE.

THEIR AMMUNITION GAVE OUT

General Chamorro's Loss is Eight Hundred Killed and Wounded—Government Forces Said to Have Lost One Thousand Men.

Bluefields, Nic., March 3.—News of the crushing defeat of General Chamorro at Tiana on February 22, leaked out here today and it was officially confirmed that Chamorro's force was wiped out and that he barely escaped with a handful of his followers.

His loss in killed, wounded and captured is given as 800. He estimates his opponent's loss at 1,000.

His defeat was due to the giving out of his cartridges. As a military menace, the provisional army now seems to merit no higher classification than that of guerrillas.
