A BRAKE ON NAVY BUILDING

DEMOCRATIC HOUSE COMMITTEE MAY CUT PLANS IN TWO—ECONOMY MOVE.

REFERS TO MOSQUITO FLEET

Chairman Padgett of the House Committee on Naval Affairs believes One Dreadnaught Each Year Will Do—Refers to Mosquito Fleet.

Washington, July 11.—An important vote in the naval policy of the United States may come as a result of a democratic control of the House. For several years this country has been operating on what is known as the 2-battle-ship program. This means the authorization and the construction each year of two first class battleships.

The advocates of this policy say it is necessary, if the United States is to keep anywhere near abreast of European governments in naval armament. Discussion of appropriations for naval purposes by members of the house committee on naval affairs has disclosed the fact that the chairman of the committee, Mr. Padgett of Tennessee, will oppose appropriations for two battleships and that his wishes in the matter may prevail.

Economy Caused the Move.

Chairman Padgett defends his position upon the grounds of economy. A modern battleship cannot be constructed for less than 10 million dollars. Mr. Padgett and his associates propose to authorize the construction of only one ship each year, and thus save the government that amount annually. Officials of the navy department and others interested in the naval expansion policy of the United States are seriously concerned over the probability of action by the house hostile to that policy.

This year, with the United States operating under the 2-ship program, England is building five Dreadnaughts and Germany four, to say nothing of other increases in the world's navies. Representative Hobson believes this country is rapidly falling behind in naval development and has frequently warned his colleagues in congress to that effect. He holds, too, that a liberal battleship policy is not nearly so expensive as a spasmodic one, which is called into action only when there is trouble afoot. Thus, in the war with Spain, which was not by any means a first class naval power, this country was so poorly equipped with modern fighting craft that it had to buy yachts and merchant steamers, hastily equip them in the best manner it could and send them out to keep fight.

And the Fleet Was Useless.

That mosquito fleet, as it was generally called, cost the United States in that one year alone about 50 million dollars and it was absolutely worthless as a naval asset when the war was over.

The present 2-battleship program will leave the United States this year with six, Germany with eight and Japan with four Dreadnaughts. Next year America will have eight, Germany thirteen and Japan six. In 1913 America will have ten, Germany seventeen and Japan seven. In 1914 the United States will have twelve, Germany twenty-one and Japan nine.
