IMPORTED COTTON MUST BE FUMIGATED AFTER FEB. 1, 1916

Washington, Sept. 17.—The acting secretary of agriculture has signed a regulation requiring that after February 1, 1916, all imports of raw cotton must be fumigated at the port of entry before it can be released by the customs officials. The purpose



of this is to make certain that the pink bollworm found in Egyptian and other imported cotton, and other destructive cotton insects found abroad shall not be introduced into American cotton fields. The danger from the pink bollworm is especially great, as this insect may infest seed left accidentally in the bale through faulty ginning. If this seed should become mixed with seed used for plant ed, or be planted accidentally near growing cotton, the pink bollworm might get a foothold and cause the great damage in this country that it does in foreign cotton fields.

Fumigation is required after a thorough study and after hearings on the subject by the department, which establish clearly that hydrocyanic acid gas, properly used, will kill all insects in the bale without damaging the quality of the cotton. The department has worked out a method whereby whole bales can be fumigated in a vacuum tank quickly and without danger to the operators.

The requirement of fumigation will be in addition to the previous regulation still in force, which requires that all mills using foreign cotton screen their buildings completely to burn all seed found in the foreign bales.

The text of the regulation which is effective on or after February 1, 1916, is as follows:

"Cotton imported from countries which do not maintain cotton inspection and certification will be delivered to the permittee for disinfection, upon the filing with the collector of customs of a bond in the amount of \$5,000, or in an amount equal to the invoice value of the cotton if such value be less than \$5,000, with approved sureties, conditioned upon disinfection of the cotton, under the supervision of an inspector of the department of agriculture, and upon the re-delivery of the cotton to the collector of customs within 40 days from the arrival of the same at the port of entry. The cotton shall not be removed from the port of entry, nor shall any bale or other container of the cotton be broken or opened for sampling, until a written notice is given to the collector of customs by an inspector of the department of agriculture that the cotton has been properly disinfected."

HYDE TRIAL PUT OFF AGAIN: EIGHTH TIME

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 16.—When the fourth trial of Dr. B. Clarke Hyde was called in the criminal court Wednesday Judge E. E. Porterfield granted the state's application for a continuance until the January term. Floyd Jacobs, prosecuting attorney, told the court he desired the case continued because it had been impossible to have some of the state's principal witnesses here at this time. Today's was the eighth continuance since Sept. 8, 1913, the date originally set for starting the fourth trial.

TRANSFER SCHOOL LAND FUNDS.

About \$400,000 Available for Loans to Homeseekers.

Oklahoma City, Sept. 15.—At the meeting of the state school land commissioners this week transfer was made to the department of home ownership of all the funds that are on hand belonging to that new department. The department is starting out with about \$400,000 for loaning on this new plan. The first loan will be made in the course of a few weeks as the department is now fully organized and there are many applications on file for loans.

TREASURE TRAIN NO 4: ANOTHER GOLD SHIPMENT

Bangor, Me., Sept. 16.—Arrangements are being made by the railroads and an express company for the transportation from Halifax to New York of the fourth consignment of gold and securities from London to strengthen the allies' war credits in this country. It is expected that a steel train will be sent to Halifax in a day or two. The amount of this confinement is not definitely known here, but it is said to be not far from fifty million dollars.

BELGIANS SAY GERMANS ARE MOVING RAILROADS

Havre, France, Sept. 16.—The Belgian government has protested to neutral states against the action of the German administration in tearing up and transporting to Poland the tracks of the Belgian railroads. The protest is based on an article of the fourth Hague convention which stipulates that the occupation of invaded territory shall consist only of occupation de facto. Removal of the railroads, the note contends will make much more difficult the transaction of business by a large population of Belgium.


