KNIGHT J. W. GOLLEDGE WILL CELEBRATE THE EVENT IN KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS HALL NEXT MONTH.

Next month a golden wedding anniversary will be celebrated in this city under unique circumstances, when Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Golledge of this city will entertain their friends in the Castle Hall of Myrtle Lodge Knights of Pythias, Mr. Golledge having been a member of that order for 46 years.

He has retired, and is now a pensioner of the International Typographical Union, having affiliated with that organization shortly after it was founded, and has maintained his standing ever since.

Permission was granted by the lodge at its last session to use the hall for this purpose, and the occasion will be made a gala event.

Mr. Golledge was born at Utica, New York, in 1842, but before he was a year old he was taken by his parents to Wales, where his early education was begun.

At the outbreak of the Civil war he enlisted in the army of the south and served with distinction until the close. After peace was declared he reentered the newspaper field and was employed as compositor, correspondent, and editor on many of the larger papers of Texas.

In 1865 he was married to Miss Ellen Montgomery of Houston. To this union three children were born, two of whom are living.

In the spring of 1893 he moved to this city and for 12 years was connected with the printing industry in Ardmore. He recently retired, and together with his wife, he spends his time between their two children, who are married, one living here and the other in Houston, Tex.

Mr. Golledge joined the order of Knights of Pythias at Waco, Tex., in 1868, and has always been a very enthusiastic member. The local lodge is planning to give him and his venerable wife a great reception upon the fiftieth anniversary of their wedding, which will occur on the night of December 18.

At the end of the first half the score stood 27 to 0 in favor of Shawnee, but this one-sided score only caused the Ardmore boys to fight the harder. They went into the second half with new fight and determination, and, though the opponents were fighting with the invincible spirit of a victorious team, they were able to score only once during this half, making the final score 33 to 0.

Though not actually participating in the game, the girls of A. H. S. played a very prominent part in keeping the Athletic Association from debt. With only one day's advertising, led by such leaders as Misses Cora Dyer, Carol Daube, and Elizabeth Myers, the girls canvassed the town, selling the tickets, and outstripped the sales of the boys by almost two to one. The girls have joyfully supported the team throughout the season, and have been one of the most potent factors in the rejuvenation of athletics and athletic spirit in the A. H. S. They have never ceased to cheer the team, whether in victory or defeat.
