## OIL and GAS NEWS

### Completed Steel Tank.

Lawrence Gas company No. 12 in section 9-4-3 has been completed at a total depth of 1125 feet and is making about 200 barrels. The company's steel tank has been completed and oil was turned into it today. A location has been made for No. 13 and drilling will be begun at once.

### West of Healdton.

Tools have been shipped from Electrica, Texas, by Mead & Neely, who will drill the well in section 34-3-4, in Jefferson county. The tools were in Ardmore yesterday and were shipped over the Ringling road this morning. The land upon which the well in 34-3-4 is located belongs in fee to Mrs. John Ringling.

### Ringling Wildcat.

G. W. Strawn et al in section 29-4-4, west of Ringling, are underreaming to set the 8-inch casing at a depth of about 600 feet. When the casing is set, drilling will be resumed. At a depth of 535 feet a very nice gas sand was found in this well, but the water broke in and the casing had to be pulled. This is a favorable looking wildcat well.

### Ordered in Steel Tanks.

The Crystal-Dundee companies have ordered in four 55,000-barrel steel tanks. These tanks are en route now and will be built in the southeast quarter of section 8. The grading for all of them is now being done. These companies have recently finished two wells on the Keck property in section 5, one of which had a production of 552 barrels and the other 211 barrels.

### Fox Pool the Attraction.

J. P. Shannon, who is with Snowden Bros., and the Lawrence Gas company, arrived here yesterday from Longview, Tex., where he is drilling a wildcat well. Mr. Shannon was attracted to Ardmore by the Gypsy gas well and he will spend a few days in that territory, looking for leases for his company. The well which he is drilling in east Texas is at a depth of about 700 feet.

### A Deep Test.

G. W. Strawn No. 3 in section 23-3-3 is being drilled deeper. The well is now more than 1,000 feet and is good for a production of from 300 to 400 barrels. The well had so much gas that the owners regard it as being an excellent location for the drilling of a deeper test. No. 4 well for the same company will be drilled

by Haggood. No. 5 will be drilled by Nichols, and both of these contractors will be ready to start within a short time.

### Maloney's New Well.

H. M. McQueen, president of the Maloney Oil & Gas company, who has been at Ringling for the past five weeks, has returned to his office in Kansas City. The Maloney people completed one well while Mr. McQueen was there, and will begin drilling another immediately. The well completed a few days ago had a production of 600 barrels a day.

### From the Fox Pool.

Sol F. Kimbrell, who owns several tracts of land in the new Fox pool, is an Ardmore visitor. The Gypsy people drilled a well a couple of years ago on Mr. Kimbrell's land, but did not go as deep as they did in the second well, where the big gas sand was found. The Kimbrell well is located about one-half mile away and had a very nice oil showing and since a prospective field lies there this well will probably be deepened.

### From Southwest Texas.

Hugh L. Sturm arrived in Ardmore yesterday from Uvalde, Tex. Mr. Sturm recently abandoned a wildcat well at Paradise, in Wise county, Tex. The well had reached a depth of 1920 feet. The rig and string of tools was sold to Tippitt & Co., who are at Gainesville, Tex., and will be used in drilling a well at Holland, in Bell county, Tex. Mr. Sturm is now drilling at Uvalde at a depth of 1800 feet. His well west of Wichita Falls, at Goree, Tex., has been abandoned at a depth of 2200 feet. At Uvalde, the second well is being drilled by Bloom & company. That well is now at a depth of 500 feet.

### BOUGHT PIPE LINE

Twin State Oil Company Will Ship Out Its Earthen Storage.

J. Howard Pew Pipe Line company has purchased the 3-inch pipe line from the Healdton field to Ringling, which was built by the Theima Oil & Gas company. The Pew pipe line is a subsidiary of the Sun company which is one of the largest oil companies in the United States. Some of the tank cars of the Sun company have already arrived and a request has been made of the Santa Fe Railway company for some of their tank cars, which will be used in shipping oil from Ringling. least a great portion of it, will be shipped to Sabine Pass, Texas, and will there be loaded on oil steamers which belong to the Sun company and will be taken to the company's refinery at Philadelphia. The Twin State Oil company, which is the Oklahoma producing subsidiary of the Sun company, has something like 30,000 barrels of earthen storage oil in the field which will be gotten rid of through the pipe line immediately. This line has a capacity of something like 4,000 barrels a day, but whether it will be operated to its capacity or not is not known.

### PIKE COUNTY OPERATIONS

Oklahoma Oil Men Take Leases in Arkansas and Start the Drill.

Glenwood, Ark., Nov. 20.—Oil and gas leases aggregating upwards of 35,000 acres were today passed through Graham as local representative by Ozan Lumber Company to Hamilton and associates of Tulsa and Oklahoma City for immediate development. The lands lie between this place and the asphalt mines and oil springs of this (Pike) county twenty miles south. Other operations in this district are, oil reported at 1250 feet, 35 miles southwest near Nashville, by Perpetual Oil & Gas Company (Pippin and associates of Muskogee); McCall and Graham down 650 feet on test near Locksburg, forty miles west; Brown and associates report million feet gasser in their number 1, between this place and Waldron and rig up for starting on their No. 2, five miles this side of No. 1.

L. B. Renous, for ten years advance driller for the Standard, in Mexico and California deep well operations, and for the past two years in the Cushing field, states here today after two weeks' survey of the situation that the Pike county, Arkansas, district is likely to develop as sensational oil developments as the Kern county, California field, which are almost identical as to asphalt, oil spring, manganese deposit, and other earth structures and surface formations.

Oil representatives are beginning to get on the ground after leases, and operations. Among those registered at local hotels are J. H. McDonald of Louisiana, L. B. Renous, Cushing, N. B. Graves, Mexico, Chas. F. Hamilton, Tulsa, and McNeill of Oklahoma City.

### Gas in Arkansas.

Glenwood, Ark. Nov. 21.—The fourth attempt to shut in the big 20 million foot gasser near Alma, between this

place and Fort Smith was reported a failure last night. The gas pressure of the well lifted 1,000 feet of casing and shattered cement packing. Burke & Son drillers, report its the heaviest gasser encountered in their experience of 20 years' drilling.
