OIL and GAS NEWS

The Samoset well south of Joiner in section 11-5-3 is drilling at 1300 feet.

Awireo Oil company in section 25-5-3 is drilling at a depth of 1628 feet. This well is east of Ardmore.

George A. Todd of Ponca City, superintendent of the Gainesville refinery, arrived here yesterday and left at once for the fields.

Robert L. Russell of Tulsa is back in the Ardmore oil district and is playing the game with the other old-timers in the Fox community.

Hugh L. Sturm, after a brief visit to the Ardmore oil district, has returned to Wichita Falls, and from there he will go to Uvalde, Tex., where he is drilling a wildcat well.

J. T. Jackson, who for some weeks has been employed on the well of W. J. Scott, south of Sulphur and near Drake, in Murray county, has returned to his home in this city.

WILL CARTER COUNTY GAS BE PIPED INTO TEXAS?

When the Gypsy Oil Company drilled in a big gas well in section 28-2-3, near the town of Fox, in the western portion of this county, The Ardmoreite called attention to the probability of the Lone Star Gas Company's coming after this gas to supply its customers in Fort Worth, Dallas, Gainesville, Sherman, Denison and Denton. The company has these towns connected with a sixteen-inch gas main with the Petrolia gas field. The company has purchased a large gas area around Loco in Stephens County, and is now preparing to build a sixteen-inch gas line from the Texas line into the Loco field. The Fox field is near the Loco gas field, the line would have to be extended but a few miles to connect the Texas cities with the Fox gas well.

It now looks as if this paper was right in its apprehensions. A. G. Reed has been sent from the Lone Star office in Fort Worth, to make an investigation of this well, and to report on the gas possibilities of the Fox district.

We would rather see the gas from that area brought into Ardmore. We can use it. This city has been planning to go after that gas. Municipalities work more slowly than companies work, and if there is really a big gas area there, the Lone Star people are going after it.

Ardmore ought to double its energies. We will be hampered in building a city if the gas near us is conveyed to other towns.
