Man Killed in Poker Game.

A shooting scrape occurred near Oswalt Sunday night in which Pete Roland was shot and fatally wounded by John Allen. For a time it was thought that he would possibly recover but his death occurred at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon.

From parties who live near Oswalt and who were in town Tuesday we learn the following in regard to the affair.

On Sunday night a crowd of men, some six or seven, were engaged in a brush poker game about three-quarters

of a mile west of Oswalt. While the game was in progress John Allen and a companion came upon them, and with drawn six-shooters demanded that they hold up their hands. While they were engaged in searching the men Pete Roland ran and was shot by John Allen. They secured about \$72 from those who stood still and submitted to the searching and when this searching process was finished they proceeded to search Pete Roland, who lay on the ground with a bullet wound through his body and about \$22 was secured from him. Sheriff Smith was in the neighborhood en route to Orr Monday when he was apprised of the occurrence and County Attorney Logsdon went to the scene Monday to make an investigation.

Up to the time the paper went to press no arrests had been made, but they will no doubt be landed in jail in a few days.

Died Near Thackerville.

The death of S. R. Cain, who lived west of Thackerville, occurred last Saturday morning, after a lingering illness of tuberculosis. Deceased was 37 years of age and is survived by a wife and several children.

The funeral and interment occurred Sunday afternoon, funeral services being conducted by Rev. Wheeler of Gainesville and interment taking place in the Mahota cemetery.

Death of E. Shoemaker.

After an illness of a little over a week the death of E. Shoemaker occurred at his home in the White Sand community a few miles east of Bennington last Friday evening about 6:30 o'clock. The cause of his death was swamp fever.

Mr. Shoemaker was one of the early settlers of this section of the county, having resided here something like twenty-five years. He was one of the most highly respected citizens of this community.

The funeral services were held Saturday afternoon in the church at Old Bennington, being conducted by Rev. W. J. B. Lloyd, after which the remains were interred in the cemetery at that place under the auspices of the Bennington Masonic lodge, of which the deceased was an honored member.

The deceased is survived by his wife and several children, besides a large number of other relatives of this place. He also has three brothers and a sister in Mississippi, who were unable to be here for the funeral.

BANKERS MUST HELP UPBUILD U. S. COMMERCE

New York, Dec. 3.—The part which bankers must take in upbuilding the commerce of the United States will play an important part in the discussions to be featured at the international trade conference which began a three-day session here today.

The rearrangement of the foreign exchange market due to the war, and the abnormal amount of exports over imports has affected manufacturers as well as bankers and other business interests. The solution of the foreign exchange problem will be discussed in reference to dollar exchange drafts on New York, drafts on New York or any other American city are not new but their use in the past has been very limited, and one of the objects of the conference is to disseminate information among American business men as to the value of New York exchange. Among the speakers on the program are Benjamin Joy, vice-president of the Shant National bank, Boston; J. J. Arnold of the First National bank, Chicago; David H. Benny, Irving National bank, New York, and V. Gonzales, banking advisor of the N. A. M. and member of the international high commission.

GOVERNOR WILL NOT INTERFERE Execution of Henry Bookman Will Be First in Electric Chair.

Oklahoma City, Dec. 5.—Governor Williams today instructed the state pardon officer, J. M. Crook, that he would not interfere in the case of Henry Bookman, a negro from McIntosh county, who is under sentence of death in the electric chair next Friday. Unless the execution be prevented by an inquiry in the courts as to the sanity of the prisoner, the first legal execution in Oklahoma for more than four years will take place next Friday. It will be the first electrocution in Oklahoma.

QUITS NAVY FOR OKLAHOMA WEALTH

Vallejo, Cal., Dec. 5.—Lieutenant Edson C. Oak, acquitted by a court martial recently on charges growing out of the boiler explosion on the United States cruiser San Diego a year ago, has been notified, it was learned today, that his resignation had been accepted by Secretary of the Navy Daniels.

Secretary Daniels in reviewing the findings of the court martial criticized the exoneration of Lieutenant Oak, when Lieutenant K. L. Hill, his subordinate, was sentenced to lose forty numbers in his grade.

It was said at Mare Island navy yard today that Lieutenant Oak had been trying to obtain his resignation for several months. He has heavy oil interests in Oklahoma and is reputed wealthy.

ECLIPSE OF SUN.

North America to Be in Darkness February 3.

A total eclipse of the sun, a rare astronomical phenomenon, will be observed in all parts of North America early next year. The 1916 eclipse fixes the date for February 3.

Many persons interested in scientific matters are making preparations to watch the eclipse through the most powerful telescopes obtainable. Astronomy classes at the colleges expect an unusual treat as it is only once or twice in a lifetime that a total eclipse of the sun may be seen.

Aside from the total eclipse there will be two partial solar eclipses during 1916. These will occur July 30 and December 24. Neither will be visible in the United States.

BEGIN SUIT AGAINST GERMAN SHIP CECEILE

Boston, Dec. 6.—Judge Morton of the United States district court has fixed today as the date for the start of the final arguments in the suits against the North German Lloyd steamship Kronprinzessin Cecelle, brought by the National City bank and the Guaranty Trust company of New York and two private individuals. The libels were brought against the company for failure to land approximately \$12,000,000 in gold and silver that was being sent to England and France, Capt. Polack of the Cecelle on the night of July 21, 1914, received word that war was about to be declared by Germany against France, England and Russia, and turned back to America, docking at Bar Harbor. The Cecelle is now interned in East Boston.

Two decrees accompanied the report, one creating the post of commander in chief of the French armies and the other appointing General Joffre "commander in chief of the armies of the northeast" to the new supreme command.


