### OIL and GAS NEWS

Humble - Gypsy - Stalt Companies No. 14, Well No. 11 is being spudded in today. Rig timbers are on the ground for Nos. 12, 13, 15 and 16.

McMan Corsicana Companies have recently completed rigs for Nos. 40, 41, and 42 on the E. T. Richards lease in section 6-4-3.

A gate valve of 1,000 pounds resisting strength has arrived and the Gypsy Oil Company hoped to be able to shut in their big gas well in section 28-2-3 today.

Oklahoma Star Oil company No. 2 on the Ingram lease in section 16-4-2 reached the top of the sand at 909 feet, and the well is being drilled in today.

Frank Frantz, former governor of Oklahoma, was here yesterday on business matters connected with the oil fields. He left last night and probably is present at the state republican meeting in Oklahoma City today.

Carter Oil Company on the Ward lease in 6-4-3 has a rig up on location

Mr. Gillespie of the production department of the Gypsy Oil Company arrived in the city last night over the Frisco and he and R. W. Coe left this morning for the Gypsy well in the Fox district.

R. L. Steiner of Claremore is in the city. He came here to let the contract for the drilling of the well in section 5-2-3 which is north of the Gypsy gas well at Fox and in the same township. When that well starts, it will be the most interesting oil test drilling in this part of the state and probably the most interesting in the entire state.

Crosbie on Elg Deal's. Some days ago the Corsicana Petroleum company took a gauge of the Crosbie lease on the Crues-Smith property in section 5-4-3. It is stated that a deal was on for the purchase of the property, but has fallen through. Mr. Crosbie some months ago is reported to have sold his in-

terests in the Ardmore refinery and is now on a deal to dispose of the Hotel Tulsa, a property worth a half million dollars, to the Huckins brothers, owners of the Lee-Huckins hotel in Oklahoma City.

W. A. Thompson was an Ardmore visitor yesterday from Marsatta. He was in conference with local oil men. Mr. Thompson has royalty interests at Healdton and is playing the new field in the Fox district.

Ben C. Ithel, a geologist of Tulsa, is in the city doing some private work for oil companies. Mr. Ithel spent four years in the different fields of Mexico and returned to the United States during the present year.

New Company Organized. The Fox Pool Oil company has been organized with a capital stock of \$12,000. Some of the stockholders are: R. L. Steiner and R. B. Jones of Claremore, L. S. Dolman, J. R. Gilman, C. E. Sykes and Ernest Hendon of Ardmore. This company was organized to take over the Sykes-Gilman leases in the north part of the Fox district, where a well will be drilled in section 5-2-3. The company's headquarters will be in Ardmore, and the officers have not been chosen.

Demand for Gasoline. George A. Todd of Oklahoma City who was on a visit yesterday to the Gainesville refinery, stopped off here on his way back to his office to confer with his attorney, Chas. von Weisse, and to see some of the local producers. The Gainesville plant is now handling some barrels of crude each day and the runs will be heavier within a short time, when connection has been made with the properties of the Dundee-Crystal, the Boxana and the Healdton Oil and Gas company. Healdton crude is making about 7 1/2 per cent gasoline, and sales are being made as far away as the New England states, New Jersey and the Carolinas. Gasoline is in big demand, and the price keeps advancing. The advance has been so rapid that the government has begun an inquiry into the cause.

ROXANA INCREASES CAPITAL. Has Largest Capital Stock of Any Operating Company in State.

Papers certifying an increase in the capital stock of the Roxana Petroleum company from \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000 were filed Tuesday with Secretary of State J. L. Lyon. So far as capital stock is concerned, this makes the Roxana the largest domestic corporation within the state. Recent acquisition of considerable valuable property around Tulsa and in the oil fields made necessary the increase in stock.

The papers were accompanied by a check for \$7,000, which is the state's fee for recording the increase. This is one of the largest fees ever paid to the state for the increase of the capital stock of a corporation. Exactly the same amount of fee was paid early in the year when the Prairie Pipe Line company was chartered to operate in Oklahoma.—Oklahoman.

MUSKOGEE NEGROES SAFE FROM MOB IN TULSA

Muskogee, Dec. 28.—Phil Williams, alias Green, and Homer Matthews, the two negroes who escaped lynching at the hands of a mob here Sunday night, were taken to Tulsa instead of McAlester, as alleged by the authorities here to deceive those bent on lynching the blacks.

The funeral of Patrolman Neal, who was shot by the blacks, was held Monday.

Trial of the negroes will take place in February, and it is generally believed here that the two slayers will go to the electric chair before the expiration of 1916. A preliminary hearing probably will be given the negroes next week.
