COUNTY AND CITY OFFICERS TOOK HOLIDAY

COURT HOUSE WAS DESERTED AND CITY HALL VACANT ALL DAY YESTERDAY, WHILE OFFICIALS TOOK REST.

Yesterday all county and city offices were closed and the officials took advantage of the holiday and a majority of them went hunting the elusive quail.

The county officials are beginning to give their offices the annual cleaning and taking stock of supplies, and the county commissioners are making their plans for better roads in the county during the coming year. The road problem is one that has given the county commissioners a great deal of trouble on account of the magnitude of the work that is needed, and the limited funds with which to accomplish it. They are making their plans, however, to make the money go as far as possible, and give the taxpayers all they can with the means at their command.

County Treasurer Yell states that the taxpayers have come forward and paid the first half of their taxes remarkably well this year, and there will be only a few delinquents to pay the penalty. Another feature that portends good times is the fact that a number of them paid all instead of half their taxes, as required by law.

County Assessor Mencon will begin the work of assessing immediately, and will mail out notices according to law for people to report and render their taxes. This will make the task of assessing the valuation of the county much easier than it has previously been.

OTHER PLACES DUMPING POOR ON THIS CITY

BENEVOLENT SOCIETY PROTESTING AGAINST ABUSE OF SOME OTHER PLACES — WILL DRAW THE LINE.

Within the past two weeks, fourteen families have moved into this city from surrounding towns, counties and states, and immediately made application to the benevolent society for help. One family of fifteen without scarcely a thing in the house, have at the present time two of the members in the hospital with pneumonia and the others are in good shape to contract the disease as they are poorly clad, poorly housed and worse fed.

The Benevolent Society of this city is doing a noble work among the actual resident poor of this city, but the officers of that body will draw the line from now on, on itinerants who are told in other places that Ardmore people will see that they get all they want to eat and wear. If they will only apply to the Benevolent Society, henceforth, people moving here had better become prepared to exist until they can find employment, or they will be sorry, according to the president of the society.

In speaking of employment, Mrs. Curtis states that every one of the applicants for charity state that they expected to find work here, but were disappointed. The warning was given early in the season that Ardmore had sufficient workmen in all trades, and for others to stay away if they wished to make a living. In the face of this, the probation officer states, they come for the express purpose of having other people care for them through the winter.

The Benevolent Society will hold a business meeting Monday afternoon at the court house for the purpose of discussing various matters, and every member is urgently requested to be present.
