NOTICE FOR PROPOSALS FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the mayor and Board of Commissioners of the city of Ardmore, Oklahoma, on the 4th day of April, 1916. Proposals by contractors will be received at the office of the mayor of the city of Ardmore until 6 o'clock p. m., on the 18th day of April, 1916, for furnishing the materials and performing the work necessary in improving the following streets and portions thereof in the city of Ardmore in the manner and subject to the conditions following, to-wit:

"That portion of G street, southwest, from the south line of Stanley Boulevard to the north line of Moore street, including alley crossings and street intersections."

Said streets to be improved by grading, paving with bituminous macadam, and constructing concrete curbs and gutters.

Said improvements shall be 26 feet wide from inner line to inner line of concrete curbs, of which width 23 feet shall consist of bituminous macadam as contemplated by U. S. patent No. 814797, the same to be laid according to detailed plans and specifications on file in the office of the city clerk of the city of Ardmore. On either side of said macadam pavement shall be laid a concrete gutter 18 inches wide and a concrete curb 4 inches in thickness, the same to be laid according to detailed specifications on file in the office of the city clerk of the city of Ardmore. The sub-grade shall be thoroughly prepared to receive said pavement as provided by detailed plans and specifications in the office of the city clerk, and upon said subgrade when so prepared there shall be laid a 4-inch foundation of crushed stone, upon which foundation when properly prepared shall be laid a 2-inch layer of chats or small rock that will pass a one-inch ring with a mixture of 20 per cent ground asphalt as a binder. The whole of said improvements to be constructed, finished, oiled and rolled according to aforesaid patent process and the detailed plans and specifications on file in the office of the city clerk.

All persons proposing to bid on said improvements are hereby notified that there is now on file in the office of the city clerk of the city of Ardmore, an agreement duly executed by James S. Downard, who owns and controls the patent process aforesaid for the city of Ardmore, to permit the use of said patent process by the successful bidder in consideration of the payment to the said James S. Downard, of the sum of fifty cents per square yard, for each and every square yard of improvements covered by this contract.

All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and plainly marked in ink on the outside, and each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check drawn on some bank in the city of Ardmore, Oklahoma, made payable to the city clerk of the city of Ardmore in the sum of \$500.00. The contractor to whom the contract for said improvements may be awarded will be required to execute to the city of Ardmore a construction bond for the full and faithful execution of the work and the performance of the contract and for full protection of the city and all property owners interested against any loss or damage by reason of negligence or improper execution of the work, in an amount equal to 20 per cent of the estimated cost of said improvements; also an additional bond in the sum of 20 per cent of the estimated cost of said improvements; conditioned on the maintenance of said improvements in good condition for a period of five years from and after completion and acceptance of said work.

The contractor to whom said work may be awarded shall receive in payment for said work, street improvement bonds, at par, issued and secured as provided by the laws of the state of Oklahoma; provided that in case the property owners shall elect to pay cash for said improvements, as they may go under the laws of Oklahoma, then in that event the city reserves the right to pay for said improvements in cash, or part cash and part bonds.

All proposals for the construction of said improvements will be considered by the mayor and board of commissioners of the city of Ardmore, Oklahoma, at a meeting to be held at session chambers in the said city

at 8 o'clock, p. m., on the 18th day of April, 1916, and the contract will then be awarded to the lowest and best bidder, who will undertake to perform the work, furnish the materials and construct said improvements according to the resolution aforesaid, and the plans and specifications on file in the office of the city clerk of the city of Ardmore, and comply with all the other terms and conditions of said resolution.

The mayor and commissioners reserve the right to reject any and all proposals that may be required, if for any reason the same shall be unsatisfactory.
