MEXICANS SELL POISONED FOOD TO UNITED STATES TROOPERS

Columbus, N. M., May 21.—Poisoned food has been sold to American soldiers by Mexicans and as a result many troopers encamped between Colonia Dublan and Namiquipa have become ill. Several natives have been taken into custody by the American authorities, arrivals from the camp report, and steps have been taken to prevent a repetition of the danger. None of the poisoned soldiers is in a serious condition.

Ninety Villista prisoners captured by American cavalrymen in the engagement at Ojo Azules, Chihuahua, late in April, have been released, according to civilians returning to the border. The prisoners were held some days and questioned in an attempt to obtain information concerning the movements of the various scattered bands and then re-released, it was said.

At military headquarters here the reports concerning the release were received with little surprise, although a number of prisoners have been captured during the campaign and six of them have been imprisoned in the stockade built here.

Heavy traffic over the motor truck trail from Columbus to Namiquipa has made it almost impassable, truckmen say. In some places the road, despite efforts of the engineering corps, has become so rutted as to make impossible a greater speed than three miles an hour.

Some of the truckmen reported to the hospital on their arrival suffering from illness, presumably caused by the heavy jolting.

SELLING OFF THE BLOOMFIELD COWS

"I am going to be in the cattle business Saturday," said W. M. Baker, cashier of the office of the Five Civilized Tribes, "and I am going to sell the brutes, too," he remarked.

This sale will mark the final step in breaking up the famous Bloomfield academy, a school for Chickasaw Indian girls. The Chickasaw nation is now without a distinctly Indian school. It had been expected that the live stock at the Bloomfield farm, handled by a caretaker since the closing of the school itself two years ago would be sent to the Collins institute, a boys' school near Stonewall, but the Collins dormitory and employes' building were burned over a week ago and the school disbanded for the present. Bloomfield academy was burned in 1914.

Hargrove college, Ardmore, purchased for a school for the Chickasaw girls, has not yet been opened, but will probably be started in the fall—Muskegee Times-Democrat.
