

ARDMORE CAN SUPPORT A GOOD BAND

BUT UNLESS CITY CAN HAVE A FIRST CLASS ORGANIZATION IT IS BETTER TO HAVE NONE — PLANS DISCUSSED.

After several years without a brass band, it begins to look as if Ardmore is at last to have such an organization, that is, if the plans of the few who met with Prof. Hamilton at the Chamber of Commerce Friday go through as expected.

Those who met decided that they would ask none to join for the present except those who were able to play some instrument and who understood music, in order that they can immediately fill engagements. Later on it is proposed to take in young members and instruct them.

The Knights of Pythias Sextet set the ball to rolling in this city last fall, and it is the desire of the new organization that they be included in the proposed band. Just what steps will be taken in this direction is not known. The Pythians have a distinct organization of their own and if participating in the other does not interfere with their own plans, no doubt every member will be glad to assist in the new project.

Ardmore has had several hands in its history that have all died from one cause or another, but principally from the fact that there was too great a tendency to commercialize their ability before they had the real ability commensurate with the price asked. It is proposed that this will not be repeated in future, and that all will be harmonious. Ardmore needs a brass band and has needed one for a long time, but until the Pythians took the initiative there had been no effort made in this direction for a number of years. The public demands free open-air concerts, and if the local musicians are capable of delivering the goods they would have no trouble in securing sufficient donations to pay them for one concert each week during the summer season. Ardmore people are becoming educated musically, and its citizens are willing to support a first class organization, but will hardly contribute very liberally unless they are convinced that their money is going for such. It is assured that the newly organized band is all that could be expected, but the public will have an opportunity of judging for itself in a few days.

At the meeting Friday night it was decided to make the band a strict business proposition, to ask for no donations, and demand pay for their services wherever required by the public.




BIG EXPENSE TO TAXPAYERS.

Are the taxpayers and the business interests of Oklahoma being made the sport of the damage suit lawyers? The following from the Daily Oklahoman of May 18 justifies the suspicion:

"The district courts of Oklahoma county were loaded down with the trial of damage suits Thursday. Two were disposed of and two were placed on trial during the day. The aggregate amount sued for in the four suits is \$98,000.

"In Judge Hayson's court, in the case of W. J. Rockwood of Jones City against the Jones City Telephone company, in which he sued for \$20,000 damages for personal injuries, the jury returned a verdict in favor of the defendant company.

"In Judge Clark's court Ida F. Hasley lost her suit against Insurance Commissioner A. L. Welch for \$10,000 for damages on account of revocation of her license to sell insurance in Oklahoma.

"In Judge Oldfield's court the trial of Guy Lindsey's suit against the Gulf, Colorado & Santa Fe railroad company for \$58,000 damages for alleged personal injuries was placed on trial. Mrs. Pearl Hayden's suit against the Missouri, Kansas & Texas Railway company for \$10,000 damages for alleged personal injuries went to

trial in Judge Hayson's court. Judge Clark has another damage case set for trial commencing at 9 o'clock Friday.

"Mrs. Pearl Hayden alleges in her petition that on account of faulty coaching of steps on a passenger coach of the 'Katy' railroad she caught her feet and fell, causing her permanent injuries. The accident happened on July 18, last year.

"In Guy Lindsey's suit against the Santa Fe, the plaintiff alleges he was run over by a Santa Fe train south of Ardmore and his two feet were cut off. The accident happened in April, 1915."

Each of these cases plants a big burden of expense upon the taxpayers, and imposes heavy expense of counsel and witness fees and loss of time upon the defendants. Legitimate business and peaceful citizens should not be annoyed nor taxpayers burdened with false damage claims. Oklahoma needs an extension of the laws, placing such claims in the hands of a commission. Good citizens should not be required to leave their homes and business to make up juries in so many baseless cases. (Adv.)


