Under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Oklahoma, and an ordinance of the mayor and council of the City of Ardmore, County of Carter, State of Oklahoma, duly and regularly adopted on the 10th day of July, 1916, notice is hereby given that a special election is hereby ordered and proclaimed to be held in said city on the 31st day of July, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified property tax-paying voters of said city the following questions:

"Shall the City of Ardmore, Carter County, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its negotiable coupon bonds in the aggregate principal sum of sixty thousand dollars, (\$60,000.00), for the purpose of providing funds for the purpose of purchasing site for and erecting a convention hall, which site and convention hall is to be owned and controlled exclusively by said city, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes upon all the taxable property in said city, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest not to exceed five and one-half (5 1/2) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and to become due within twenty-five years from date."

No person shall be entitled to vote on said proposition except he is in all respects a qualified property tax-paying elector of said city. In case a majority of the qualified voters, as above described, shall vote affirmatively for the issuance of said bonds, the mayor and city councilmen shall issue the same, and not otherwise.

The voting place of said election shall be at the City Hall and the following named persons are designated and appointed to conduct said election at the voting place; such officers shall also act as counters:

PROPOSITION NO. I.
 "Shall the City of Ardmore, Carter County, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its negotiable coupon bonds in the aggregate principal sum of forty-five thousand dollars, (\$45,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for the extension of the water works system, which extensions are to be owned and controlled exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes upon all the taxable property in said City, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest not to exceed five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and to become due within twenty-five years from date."

PROPOSITION NO. II.
 "Shall the City of Ardmore, Carter County, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its negotiable coupon bonds in the aggregated principal sum of twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars, for the purpose of providing funds for extension of the sewer system, which extensions are to be owned and controlled exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes upon all the taxable property in said City, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest not to exceed five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and to become due within twenty-five years from date."
