**SWEET CAPORAL**

**HYDROPHOBIA.**

(By State Board of Health).

With the advent of the real hot weather there is apt to be in scattered localities over the state more or less apprehension over rabies or hydrophobia. There is less reason for such apprehension than is generally believed, although hydrophobia is a real and terrible disease and no precaution should be omitted when there is any reason to suspect its existence. Nevertheless there is more actual danger of hydrophobia in hot than in cold weather. Dogs like human beings may be more irritable in extremely hot weather; in fact they are likely to be. But dogs are no more liable to rabies in hot weather, even during the so-called "dog days" than they are at other times of the year. In fact the records of the state board of health show more cases of rabies during some of the comparatively cold months than in summer.

**Transmission of Rabies.**

The only known way in which hydrophobia ever has been transmitted to a human being is from the bite of some animal, generally a dog, already suffering from rabies. The virus which causes the disease seems to exist in the saliva, rather than directly in the blood. Not every person bitten by an animal with the rabies has hydrophobia. In fact one authority has estimated that only 15 per cent. of persons bitten by dogs suffering with rabies themselves develop the disease. The percentage is higher in the case of wolf bites. The nearer the bite to the central nervous system the greater the chance for the development of hydrophobia. If possible the dog which has bit

ten a person should not be killed immediately, but should be confined under observation a week or ten days in order to give the disease a chance to develop. If this is done an examination of the dog's brain will determine whether or not the animal has the rabies. If the animal is killed before the rabies has an opportunity for development detection of the disease is difficult. The dog should never be killed by shooting through the head, as this often makes an accurate examination impossible. Prompt reports will be made by the State Board of Health on all dog's heads sent to the laboratory for examination. Care should be taken in the packing of the head and it should be surrounded by ice and sawdust, especially in hot weather. Too often heads arrive at the laboratory so decomposed, owing to improper packing, that no examination is possible.

**Treatment of Rabies.**

Where there is the least suspicion that a person has been bitten by a dog afflicted with rabies the Pasteur treatment should be taken. This should be under the direction of a physician, but the treatment will be furnished free of cost for persons unable to pay for it. Persons who can pay are expected to do so, but it is the intent of the State Board of Health that no resident of Oklahoma should be forced to go without the treatment because of poverty. The Pasteur treatment is a practically certain cure for hydrophobia, the percent of persons taking the treatment and later developing the disease being so small as to be negligible.

Can rabies be exterminated? There is only one possible answer to this question and that is that the dread disease can be conquered just as soon as the people of this country think the conquest worth while. This is not a theory. Rabies has been

driven out of England, Germany, Denmark, Japan and other countries. It was driven out by muzzling the dogs. It can be driven out in this country whenever the people believe that the lives and happiness of human beings are worth more than the comfort of dogs.

That there is need for drastic action in fighting hydrophobia is shown by the number of cases actually reported in this and other states. In one case which occurred in a country town in Oklahoma this summer a dog suffering from rabies roamed about the country biting 21 other dogs, as well as several human beings, before killed. Each of the animals bitten was liable to become a new source of infection. Each of the persons bitten ran the chance of dying the most horrible of deaths. It would appear to have been wiser and better to have had the dog muzzled, even although this procedure might not have been liked by the dog or its owner.
