New Mexican Money Being Made.
 Mexico City, Aug. 30.—The destruction of the so-called Vera Cruz issue of Mexican currency and the issuance of the new paper money known as "infalsificables" have made the government printing office one of the busiest spots in Mexico. The Vera Cruz bills, over \$50,000,000 worth of which have been destroyed, are cut into strips in a hydraulic press, transformed into pulp and made into cardboard and pastboard of which there is great scarcity. This product finds a ready sale and it is possible that the government may also destroy old documents to produce material for a government box factory in the near future.

The department now is working at high pressure to turn out the new "infalsificable" \$2 bills, sorely needed because of the scarcity of small change. Not only the modern presses but even the old hand presses are being utilized to expedite the work. The tremendous quality of stamps and post cards printed under the Huerta regime are being revaluated by the impress of a special die changing the denomination. The stamping out of copper coins has been begun and it is announced this is to be followed shortly by the coinage of both gold and silver.
