

PREPARING FOR OPENING OF SCHOOLS

INSTITUTE BEGINS AT THE HIGH SCHOOL MONDAY MORNING—TEACHERS WILL BE ASSIGNED TO WARDS DURING THE WEEK.

All teachers of the city will assemble at the high school building Monday morning at nine o'clock at which time the teachers' institute will begin and will continue throughout the week.

Some time during the week the superintendent will make his assignment of teachers for the various ward schools.

On Friday morning all teachers will go to their respective assignments where they will meet the pupils, classify them and assign them seats. The high school pupils will come to the high school building each afternoon next week between 1:30 and 3:30, when the principal of the high school and the high school teachers will enroll, classify, and assist them in selecting the proper course of study for the ensuing year.

The additions to the ward buildings will not all be completed by the morning the schools open, but the board of education thinks it better to open school at this time so that they may be able to close the school on the last Friday in May, and not be compelled to carry them over into the hot month of June. Prof. Richards estimates that there will be one thousand more pupils in the city schools this year than there was last year. He is receiving applications from all surrounding counties from pupils who wish to enter the Ardmore high school. This is fully expected to be the most successful year in the history of the school. The faculty is exceptionally strong and everything points to success.
