drilled to the Simpson sand and has been completed. A solid sand was found from 1,225 to 1,304 feet. It will make 1,000 barrels a day. This is the second good well which this company has completed this week in the south-east extension.

J. W. Hall of the DuArd Oil company is in the city today from Bennington.

Magnolia Petroleum company No. 29 Smalley in section 10-4-3 has reached the sand and is being drilled in.

Fort Ring Oil company in section 24-4-3 has reached a depth of about 800 feet and is having trouble with water.

Looking Favorable.
Northfeet Oil and Gas company in 9-5-4 south of Ringling is finding a series of gas sands and the well is looking rather favorable. The depth is not far from 1600 feet.

Rain Needed in Fields.
There is a sharp demand for water in the field for drilling and also for pumping purposes. Water wells are being drilled to obtain water for drilling wells, and unless rain falls soon the Magnolia pump station will either have to shut down or resort to water from wells.

Statesman Bought Oil Lands.
W. A. Durant was here yesterday from Durant and visited the fields. He has acquired some interests here and will make frequent trips to Ardmore from this time on. Mr. Durant has been a member of the legislature since statehood and is one of the most influential men in party affairs in Oklahoma.

Visited Wyoming Fields.
C. E. Sykes has returned from his vacation in the west and northwest. He came through in his car and his family came back by rail. Mr. Sykes visited the Wyoming fields during the summer and he is of the opinion that some good oil properties will be developed there. Oklahoma produces more oil in a week than Wyoming produces in a year, but prospecting continues in that state with good chances of developing a much better production.

Important Deep Test.
The Vernon Collins Oil company, composed of Wirt Franklin, Roy M. Johnson, Edward Galt and Sam A. Apple, has begun a very interesting deep test on the Vernon Collins lease in section 16-4-3. The location is in the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of the section and offsets the Oklahoma Star in 16 and Hamon & Colcord in 15. This well was drilled to the shallow sands some months ago and has a production of 15 barrels. The company is of the opinion that the Simpson sand extends that far to the west and they will make a test for it. S. M. Jordan, who has the contract, has moved a machine in on the location and will be drilling at once.

THELMA COMPANY SOLD OUT.
Texas Boys Pick Up a Nice Fortune by Investing in Carter County Oil.

The property of the Thelma Oil and Gas company, consisting of 20 acres on the west side of section 8-4-3 in the Healdton field upon which two wells are producing, has been sold to the India-Homa Oil and Gas company of Oklahoma City. The price paid is approximately \$90,000. The production is claimed to be from the two wells 350 barrels.

The Thelma company was organized in the early days of Healdton by T. M. Dees, T. J. Dorsett, M. A. Billard and others of Midlothian, Texas. The company's first well was a good one and is still a steady producer. A pipe line was built by the company to Ringling and later the pipe line was sold to the J. Howard Pew Pipe Line company and now the entire property remaining has been sold to the India-Homa people.

The India-Homa company was organized 20 days ago with Oklahoma City as headquarters, the capital stock being \$250,000. The officers are W. A. Durant, president; Jack Jones, vice president; W. A. Fleming Jones, vice president, and T. R. H. Smith, secretary. The company is made up of some of the best men in the state. This is the first purchase the company has made, its first venture was at Healdton, which is the greatest field in the state and in many particulars surpasses any other field in the United States. The officials of the company here today state that steps will be taken at once to build steel storage and to do additional drilling. The company is of the opinion that the production can be raised to 700 barrels a day by the drilling of additional wells.
