STATE FAIR WAS OPENED YESTERDAY

LARGE CROWDS ATTEND OPENING AND MANY EXTRA ATTRACTIONS HAVE BEEN ADDED—MANY SPECIAL DAYS.

Oklahoma City, Sept. 23.—Oklahoma's tenth annual state fair opened here today with the largest list of exhibits on record. Indications today were that the attendance of the fair, which will close October 1, will break all records.

The program for the fair calls for a number of special days. Today was State School Day, children of the public schools of the state being admitted free. Monday will be Old Soldiers' Day, Indiana Day and Fraternal Day; Tuesday, Kentucky Day and Governor's Day; Wednesday, Oklahoma City Day, Grange Day and Ardmore Day; Thursday, Tulsa Day, Derby Day and Women of '89 Day; Friday, Missouri Day, Press Day, Farm Women's Day and Boys' and Girls' Club Day.

Tractor demonstrations will be held daily except Sunday on a specially arranged field on the south end of the grounds. The space allotted last year on the east side of the grounds will also be used, allowing about fifty acres for the manufacturers to demonstrate their goods.

On Wednesday September 27, and Saturday, September 30, six of the best automobile drivers of the country are scheduled to participate in races. Cliff Woodbury, Art Klein, Eddie Hearne, Tommy Milton, Johnny Mais and Gotoff, a Russian driver, is the personnel of the entry list for the two days' races.

Johnny Rainey established a world's record for ten miles and a half mile dirt track at the Oklahoma state fair last year. An added feature of the fair this year will be the appearance of Miss Elfrieda Mais, who has entered the various events in competition with the men.

TO PREVENT FIRES OBJECT OF GOVERNOR

ISSUES A PROCLAMATION NAMING OCTOBER 9 AS FIRE PREVENTION DAY AND CALLS UPON EVERYONE TO ASSIST.

Mayor Mullen stated yesterday morning that the governor had notified him that October 9th had been set apart as fire prevention day in Oklahoma and that a proclamation would be issued to that effect. He urges the hearty co-operation of all mayors and heads of municipalities to co-operate in this work and to call upon all the school children to assist in a general cleanup that will reduce the danger of fires to a minimum.

A general cleaning up of back yards and disposing of all inflammable substances will be insisted upon by the mayor and city officials. This should be taken as a warning and work of cleaning up begin now. There are several healthy fire traps in the city that will have to be removed between now and the 9th of next month and the mayor is anxious that it be done at once before the law is invoked, which it will be if the warning is not complied with.

Superintendent Richards will be asked to co-operate with the mayor and city officials in this movement.

The automobile show at the fair is attracting much attention. Cars of all makes and sizes are being shown and demonstrated by the manufacturers.

State Fair of Missouri.
Sedalia, Mo., Sept. 23.—The Missouri state fair opened here today for the sixteenth annual time and will continue until the end of next week. Superintendents of the various departments declared the entry lists for the live stock, agricultural, dairy, apiary, horticultural, home economics, mining and other exhibits were the largest in the history of the exposition and, as a result, Sedalia is preparing today to entertain thousands of visitors from all parts of the state.

The fair is the annual "bow" of the Missouri farmer and his products of the people of the state and the exhibits are drawn from every section. The college of agriculture of the state university, the state and national departments of agriculture, good roads organizations, farm improvements associations, the county farm advisers joint together in an effort to show the farmers of the state how to increase their crops and make their farms more productive. The boys' state fair school, held by representatives of the agricultural school, attracts honor students from practically every county, who live on the fair grounds and attend a few hours of classes every day during the exhibition.

This year, of course, will be politicians' year and few are the candidates for state offices who will not appear during the week to meet their "country" constituents in an effort to build their political fences for the November election. Senator Ollie James of Kentucky will speak next Wednesday, "Democratic Day." The republican speakers also will speak here while the fair is in progress.

The program for the week calls for daily racing in both the harness and running classes, except tomorrow. A nightly horse show will be held and the \$2,500 sweepstakes for five gaited saddlers promises to bring together a large number of entries. Next Tuesday will be Trades Union Day and addresses will be made by Frank P. Walsh of Kansas City and John B. Lennon, national treasurer of the American Federation of Labor.
