OF TIMBER LANDS AND OTHER UNALLOTTED LANDS AND SURFACE OF SEGREGATED COAL AND ASPHALT LANDS BELONGING TO THE CHOCTAW AND CHICKASAW TRIBES, EASTERN OKLAHOMA
 By the UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT

There will be offered for sale at public auction at certain railroad points in Eastern Oklahoma, from October 4th, 1916, to October 31, 1916, inclusive, approximately 508,000 acres in Eastern Oklahoma belonging to the Choctaw and Chickasaw Nations of Indians, including therein approximately 223,500 acres of tribal timber lands with standing pine and hardwood timber thereon; 500 acres of other unalotted lands, and 81,000 acres of the surface of the segregated coal and asphalt lands. The timber lands and the surface of the segregated coal and asphalt lands will be offered for sale for not less than the appraised value. Land and timber will be sold together. The entire estate in the tribal timber lands and other unalotted lands will be sold, except, however, that of the segregated coal and asphalt land area only the surface will be sold, the coal and asphalt therein or thereunder being reserved except where the descriptive circular specifically states that the coal and asphalt will be sold with the surface. No person will be permitted to purchase more than 160 acres classified as agricultural land, nor more than 40 acres classified as grazing land. No limitation is placed on the acreage of timber land which may be purchased by one person. Residence on land not required. Bids may be submitted in person, or by agent with power of attorney, or by mail. Terms of sale of surface of segregated coal and asphalt lands, 25 per cent cash at time of sale, 25 per cent within one year, and balance

within two years from date of sale. Terms of sale of the tribal timber lands and other unalotted lands, 25 per cent cash at time of sale, and balance in three equal annual installments of 25 per cent each, payable in one, two, and three years, respectively from date of sale; the purchasers of any of the above mentioned lands to pay 5 per cent interest per annum on all deferred payments. Bids by mail must be accompanied by certified checks or bank drafts for 25 per cent of amount of bids. Where houses or other valuable improvements are located on the timber lands or on the surface of the segregated coal and asphalt lands, the same will be sold with the timber land or with the surface of the segregated coal and asphalt land as the case may be, at not less than the combined appraised value, said improvements to be paid for in full at time of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. NOTICE OF PROPOSALS FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Board of Commissioners and approved by the mayor of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, on the 28th day of August, 1916, proposals will be received at the office of the city clerk of the City of Ardmore, until 4 o'clock p. m., on the 10th day of October, 1916, for furnishing the materials and performing the work necessary to improve the following streets and portions thereof in the City of Ardmore, in the manner and subject to the conditions following, to-wit:

That portion of "D" street, north-west, from the north line of West Main street, and to the south line of Ninth avenue, northwest.

Said street shall be improved by grading, paving with concrete and the construction of concrete curbs and gutters, which street shall be 39 feet wide from outer line of curb to outer line of curb, and shall be laid in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared and on file with the city clerk of Ardmore, to consist of a driveway, including gutter, 29 feet wide and concrete curb 6 inches thick on either side thereof.

The sub-grade shall be thoroughly prepared to receive said pavement and the whole of said improvements shall be constructed, rolled and finished according to the detailed plans and specifications approved by the board of commissioners and on file in the office of the city clerk of said city.

All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and plainly marked in ink on the outside, and each bid shall be filed on or before 4 o'clock p. m., on the said 10th day of October, 1916, and shall be accompanied by a certified check drawn on some bank in the City of Ardmore, in the sum of \$500.00. The contractor to whom the contract for said improvements may be awarded will be required to execute to the City of Ardmore, a construction bond conditioned according to law for the full and faithful execution of the work and the performance of the contract and for the full protection of the city and all property owners interested, against any loss or damage by reason of negligence or improper execution of the work, in a sum of 30 per cent of the estimated cost of said improvements. Said contractor will also be required to execute an additional bond in the sum of 30 per cent of the estimated cost of said improvements conditioned on the maintenance of said improvements in good condition for a period of five years from and after the completion and acceptance of said work. Said bond in each instance to be subject to the approval of the mayor and commissioners.

The contractor to whom said work may be awarded shall receive in payment for said work, street improvement bonds at par, issued and secured as provided by the laws of the state of Oklahoma; provided that in case the property owners shall elect to pay cash for said improvements as they may do under the laws of Oklahoma, then and in that event the city reserves the right to pay for said improvements in cash or part cash and part bonds.

All proposals for construction of said improvements will be considered by the mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, at a meeting to be held at the session chamber in said city at 8 o'clock p. m. on the 10th day of October, 1916, and the contract will then be awarded to the lowest and best bidder, who will undertake to perform the work, furnish materials, execute the bonds and construct said improvements according to the resolution aforesaid, and plans and specifications

tions filed in the office of the city clerk of the City of Ardmore, and comply with all other terms and conditions of said resolution.

The mayor and commissioners reserve the right to reject any and all proposals that may be received, if for any reason the same shall be unsatisfactory.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ARDMORE, OKLAHOMA, DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF IMPROVING THAT PORTION OF STANLEY BOULEVARD FROM THE EAST LINE OF "F" STREET, SOUTHWEST TO THE WEST LINE OF "C" STREET, SOUTHWEST.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ARDMORE, OKLAHOMA:

1. That the mayor and commissioners deem it necessary to improve that portion of Stanley Boulevard from the east line of "F" street, southwest to the west line of "C" street, southwest.

2. That such improvements shall consist of grading, paving of bituminous macadam, curbing and guttering and such other improvements as may be necessary to complete in a thorough and workmanlike manner, the paving and draining of that portion of said street aforesaid.

3. That said improvements shall be constructed in a total width of 21 feet, of which 26 feet shall consist of a bituminous macadam driveway with a concrete gutter 24 inches wide and a concrete curb 6 inches thick on either side thereof; the same shall be constructed according to the plans and specifications and within the estimates, as prepared by the city engineer of the city of Ardmore and on file in the office of the city clerk of said city.

4. That the cost of such improvements, including alley crossings and street intersections, shall be paid by special assessments levied against the property subject to assessment for said improvements, as provided by the laws of the state of Oklahoma.

5. That this resolution shall be published for six consecutive issues of The Daily Ardmoreite, or for two issues of The Weekly Ardmoreite, a newspaper published and having a general circulation within the limits of Ardmore, Oklahoma.
