Washington, Feb. 1.—At the request of Gov. V. A. Lewis Jr. of the Choctaw nation, the bureau of Indian affairs has agreed that Melvin Cornish of McAlester may represent the tribe before the house Indian committee in the pending district bill offered by Representative Perry of Oklahoma.

ORDINANCE NO. 338. AN ORDINANCE ASSUMING JURISDICTION BY THE CITY OF ARDMORE, FOR CONSTRUCTING WATER CONNECTIONS AND SEWER LATERALS ALONG AND UNDER THE STREETS, LANCES, AVENUES AND ALLEYS OF THE CITY OF ARDMORE, PRESCRIBING THE MANNER OF PAYMENT AND THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, REPLACING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Section 1. From and after the passage and approval of this ordinance the city of Ardmore shall lay and construct all water pipe connections and sewer laterals along and under the streets, lances, alleys and avenues of the city of Ardmore.

Section 2. The construction of all water connections and sewer laterals shall be under the supervision of the superintendent of the water and sewer department and the initial cost of same shall be paid from out of the water and sewer fund of said city.

Section 3. The city of Ardmore shall lay and construct water pipes to the meter and lay sewer pipes to the curb of the streets, lances, alleys or avenues, along and under which same shall be laid.

Section 4. The property owners abutting and adjoining such streets, lances, alleys and avenues shall be charged for such water connections on the following scale:

For each new lead pipe connection the sum of \$9.49 plus \$2.00 per foot from such water main to said meter;

For each lead connection made on old services the sum of \$3.50 plus \$7.00 per foot for each foot said water mains to said meter;

For one-half-inch iron pipe water connection the sum of \$7.20 plus \$1.50 per foot from said water mains to said meter;

For three-fourth-inch iron pipe connections the sum of \$8.00 plus \$1.80 per foot from said water mains to said meter;

For each sewer connection the sum of \$6.00 per foot for such lateral.

No connection shall be made until such amount shall be paid as herein provided. Such amount shall draw interest at the rate of six per cent per annum beginning thirty days from the completion of the work.

Section 5. Any person, firm or corporation, either for hire or otherwise, making any connection to said water pipe or said sewer pipes as herein provided shall first obtain a permit for making such connections from the city engineer and collector of the city of Ardmore, and shall pay to said bookkeeper and collector, upon receipt of such permit, the amount charged against said property, in accordance with the scale of prices as set out in section 4 hereof, together with interest thereon, if any be due. No connection shall be made by any person, firm or corporation until said charges are paid and said permit is issued.

Section 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 7. For the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety, an emergency is declared to exist by reason thereof, and this ordinance shall be in force and take effect immediately from and after its passage, approval and publication.

NOTICE FOR PROPOSALS FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to a Resolution adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, and approved by the Mayor on the 27th day of November, 1917, proposals will be received at the office of the City Clerk of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, until five o'clock p. m. of Tuesday, February 12, 1918, for the furnishing of materials and the construction necessary to improve

Street, Northwest, from the South line of Broadway to the North line of Twelfth Avenue, Northwest, of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, including alley crossings and street intersections thereon.

Said improvements to consist of grading, curbing, guttering, draining and paving the same and to be constructed of a total width of thirty (30) feet from outer line to outer line of curb, on either side of said street to be a curb such six (6) inches wide, the street to be graded, and upon the sub-grade to be laid a four (4) inch concrete base and upon said base to be laid a wearing surface of two and one-half (2 1/2) inch vertical fiber, vitrified brick, and upon said brick to be placed asphaltic concrete sufficient to fill all voids.

The plans and specifications and estimates as prepared by the City Engineer are now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said city and are open to inspection of all parties.

All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and plainly marked in ink thereon and must be filed with the City Clerk by five o'clock p. m. of Tuesday, February 12, 1918, and accompanied by a certified check drawn on some bank in the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, and payable to said City Clerk in the sum of One Thousand, Five Hundred (\$1,500.00) Dollars. The successful bidder shall give a construction bond, conditioned in terms of the law and also a maintenance bond conditioned that he will keep said street in good repair for a period of five (5) years from and after the date of acceptance of same, and each bond shall be for the sum of fifty (50) per cent per cent of the amount of the City Engineer's estimate and shall run in favor of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma. All bonds by appropriate resolution to be approved by the Board of Commissioners and the Mayor of the City of Ardmore. Such bids will be opened and considered by the Board of Commissioners at eight o'clock p. m. of Tuesday, February 12, 1918, at the Session Chamber of said board. The contract will then be let to the lowest and best bidder, who will undertake to construct said improvements and furnish said materials in accordance with the plan and specifications of said City Engineer. No bids will be considered that do not contemplate the completion of the entire improvement and the payment of all incidental expenses attached to the City Engineer's estimate. Compensation shall be made as follows:

All that portion of that street as aforesaid from the South line of Broadway to the North line of Eighth Avenue, Northwest, of "C" Street, Northwest, being occupied in part by the Ardmore Street Railway Company with its tracks, and the Ardmore Street Railway Company having declined to pave between its tracks and one foot on each side thereof, the City of Ardmore will contract to do said improvements under the specifications as herein provided, but the contractor to whom said contract for construction of said improvements as aforesaid is awarded, is notified that the City of Ardmore assumes no responsibility for the payment of all the construction and labor on that portion of the street aforesaid occupied by said Ardmore Street Railway Company and one foot on each side of their tracks, but such contractor shall look to his lien, given by law against the Ardmore Street Railway Company for the payment of the material and labor furnished to pave said portions of said street aforesaid. For all the balance of the said street not occupied by said street railway company and which the city assumes no responsibility as herein provided, said contractor shall be made in street improvement bonds, issued and secured as provided by law. Any property owner thereon may pay for such assessment in cash. The city reserves the right to pay part cash, part in bonds or all in bonds for such improvements exclusive of the portion oc-

cupied by the Ardmore Street Railway Company as aforesaid at its election. The form of the contract that the City will require is now on file in the office of the City Clerk and open to inspection to all parties. The form of the bid required can be had on application to the City Clerk.

The city reserves the right to reject any and all bids and re-advertise bids for such improvements. If a successful bidder fails to execute a contract and file his said bonds within ten days after the letting of such contract, the city reserves the right to cancel said contract, and forfeit a certified check accompanying said contract to the improvement district, and advertise for bids for such improvements.
