Notice is hereby given that pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, and approved by the Mayor, on 2nd day of April, 1918, proposals will be received at the office of the City Clerk, of the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma, until five o'clock P. M., of 17th day of July, 1918, for the furnishing of materials and construction of the work necessary to improve

"M" Street, Southwest, from the South line of Bixby Avenue, to the North line of Stanley Boulevard, Southwest, including alleys crossings thereon, in the City of Ardmore, Oklahoma.

Said improvements to consist of grading, paving, curbing, guttering, and draining the said street aforesaid, which shall be for a width of twenty-two (22) feet, from outer line to outer line of curb; on each side thereof shall be constructed a combined curb and gutter of concrete, the curb to be six (6) inches thick and the gutter twenty-four (24) inches wide; the roadway between said curb and gutter shall be seventeen (17) feet wide, constructed upon a concrete base five (5) inches thick, a wearing surface of Oklahoma Rock Asphalt, two (2) inches thick when thoroughly compressed.

The plans and specifications and estimates as prepared by the City Engineer are now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City, and are open to inspection of all parties.

All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes, and plainly marked in ink thereon, and must be filed by five o'clock P.
