



JEFFERSON GARDNER DEAD

Former Governor of the Choctaw Nation Passes Away.

Hugo, I. T., April 12.—Jefferson Gardner of Eagleton, I. T., died at Idabel this morning of pneumonia after an illness of five days. The governor had been at Antlers attending court and while returning home last Sunday was taken ill at Idabel where he left the train. His condition grew worse until Friday morning when the end came. The remains were taken to his home near Eagletown for burial.

The governor was a man about 60 years of age, and had spent his entire life in the Choctaw nation. He served one term as governor about ten years ago. He was beloved by his people and highly respected by all classes.
