**NEW BANK BUILDING**

**First National Bank at Broken Arrow to Build Fine Structure.**

**CLIFF HOUSE REMAINS**

**Refugees Who Said They Saw the Structure Fall Were Mistaken.**

San Francisco, April 24.—A complete inspection, made by a representative of the Associated Press, who made a trip in an automobile, shows that comparatively little damage was done in the vicinity of the Cliff. The Cliff house still stands. This fact shows the limit of excitement to which refugees go in describing as facts what they only believe to be true. Half a dozen persons in telling their stories to press representatives mentioned seeing the Cliff house totter and fall. Several said they saw a great wave sweep bare the spot where the ruins fell.

The damage from the earthquake shock to this historic building will not exceed, according to the statement of the manager, Mr. Wilkins, \$500. The escape of the Cliff house is one of the curious features of the disaster which has befallen San Francisco. The famous Sutro baths, located near the Cliff house, with its hundreds of thousands of square feet of glass from the roofing, also was practically unharmed. Only a few of the windows in the Sutro baths and in the Cliff house were broken and the lofty chimney of the pumping plant of the former establishment was cracked only slightly.

**WEDDINGS IN THE RUINS**

**Many Women Hurried Their Marriages.**

San Francisco, April 24.—Many weddings have resulted from the recent disaster. Women, driven out of their homes are left destitute, and have appealed to the men to whom they were engaged, and immediately marriages followed.

Since the first day of the disaster an increase in the number of marriage licenses issued was noticed by the county clerk. Yesterday morning seven marriage licenses were issued in an hour.

"I don't live anywhere," is the answer given in many cases when the applicant for a license is asked where his residence is. "I used to live in San Francisco."

**SHOOK A VESSEL AT SEA**

**The Alliance's Captain Thought the Ship Had Struck.**

Astoria, Ore., April 24.—The Alliance, a Pacific steamer, which arrived this morning from Eureka, reports that the Point Arena light-house was destroyed by the earthquake. The vessel while off Eureka Wednesday morning was severely shaken. The captain thought the vessel had struck bottom, but after making soundings found it was in twelve fathoms of water. The captain became alarmed and changed his course to the westward.
