


MUTT AND JEFF—Well, Jeff Can Change His Mind, Can't He?

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T. H. S. MUST PLAY SATURDAY'S GAME

Will Have to Forego Pleasure of Witnessing Local Contest.

MAY WORK AT NIGHT

To Paint Ball White So Can Practice After Dark Hereafter.

After much dickerings by Tulsa high school authorities with the manager of the Bartlesville high school football team, the local must learned yesterday that it would be impossible to change the date set for the game Saturday was the date set originally for the game, but the Oklahoma university and Kendall teams set their game for the same day.

The high school squad worked long and diligently yesterday afternoon, and stopped only after they were not able to see the ball. To offset this handicap, it is probable that electric lights will be strung over the field and the ball painted white should the Tulsa high football team go undefeated this fall.

Coach Baker of the high school team is working with an extra set of backfield men. The regular backs are Miller, quarter; Sotser, full; Aitken, right half; and Price, left half. The new backfield is directed from quarterback position by Tattler; Gillespie plays right half, Lautaret, play left half, and Miller, the quarter on the regular team, plays full. An injury to a backfield man now will not seriously handicap the team work, where earlier in the season an injury would disrupt the backfield.

All of the regular players, and all the substitutes, who are going to Bartlesville Saturday, are in excellent condition. All of the men making the trip will get at least a chance to play in the game, unless Bartlesville is unusually stronger than is expected. Some of the players on the squad have not missed a time from practice all fall, but have not had a chance to show their real worth in a game.

NATIONAL BANKS SHOW INCREASE

Show Expansion Since The Establishment of Federal Reserve System.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—Substantial expansion of the business of the national banks since the inauguration of the federal reserve system is shown in a statement issued tonight by Comptroller of the Currency Williams, based on the returns of the 7,615 national banks of the United States to his call for their condition September 2.

The total resources of these banks on September 2, says the statement, exceeded more than \$424,000,000, the greatest resources ever shown by any previous call in the history of the national banking system, and amounted to \$12,567,099,425. The increase in resources over the call of June 23, 1915, was \$471,000,000. The increase in resources over the call of September 12, 1914, was over \$48,000,000.

Loans and discounts, including letters of credit and customers' liability on account of acceptances, amounted to \$625,000,000, being an increase over the June statement of \$105,000,000 and showing an increase compared with September 12, 1914, of \$125,000,000. The highest amount by \$27,000,000, the highest amount ever previously shown and being \$408,000,000 in excess of the total deposits in the June statement.

HUMANE AGENT HAS BIG MONTH'S WORK

Society Distributed 904 Pieces of Clothing in October.

It is believed that a record has been established by the Tulsa Humane society in distributing among the poor 904 pieces of clothing during the month of October. Never before in the history of this organization has this much clothing been asked for during any corresponding month.

Not only was the society besieged with calls for clothing but all other matters to which it attends were hard pressed during this period. There were 70 sick calls attended by more than a hundred pairs of shoes given, eight pieces of bedding and mattresses, juvenile work claimed attention in 150 cases.

The calls and demands made upon this worthy society in one month's time is almost unbelievable. Humane Officer A. M. Welch and his assistants are kept constantly at work and there is not a day that some new sorrow or trouble does not confront them to solve and ameliorate insofar as possible.

IS COMING HOME BECAUSE OF ILLNESS

Berlin Denies That Brand Whitlock Unsatisfactory to Them.

BERLIN, Nov. 4.—(City wireless to Sayville, N. Y.)—Among the items given out for publication today by the Overseas News agency was the following: "Foreign newspapers report that the German government asked the withdrawal of the American minister at Brussels, Brand Whitlock. These reports were absolutely untrue. The fact is the American minister is on a leave of absence because of failing health."

AN ALL-DAY ARTILLERY DUEL

Serbian Retiring in Good Order Before Superior Army.

LONDON, Nov. 4.—(4:02 a. m.)—An artillery duel was in progress virtually all day at Vukodrev, in the Stranitsa region, between the French and Bulgarian today, a Reuter dispatch from Salonika today.

The Serbians are reported to be retiring in good order from Tolovo before a numerically superior force. In Babusa pass, which protects the road to Philip and Monastir, the Serbians are continuing to repel furious assaults by the Bulgarians. At present both Filip and Monastir are safe although unassured, pending throughout the Monastir region, in southern Serbia, whence some three hundred refugees arrived at Salonika today.

Generally speaking, the dispatch adds, the situation of the Serbians is extremely critical but it is declared that if they are able to hold out a little longer the situation will take on an altered complexion. Further reinforcements of allied troops are being moved forward rapidly.

TOLEDO, Ohio, Nov. 4.—One of the greatest receptions in the history of the city is planned for Brand Whitlock, former mayor of Toledo, now American minister to Belgium, who has notified the state department that he will depart soon for home. A delegation will go to welcome him in Toledo.
