Position Seemingly Is Popular With Many Adept in the Profession.

PAYS \$110 A MONTH

One of the Nurse's Duties Will Be to Curtail Contagious Disease.

E. E. Greenidge, superintendent of education, was in charge of the meeting yesterday that was held to discuss the school nurse position.

The nurse will give lectures to the pupils on various phases of the health and will instruct the pupils how to carry out the suggestions.

One of the most important duties of the nurse will be to curtail the contagious diseases which arise often in schools and spread to a certain degree.

Investigate Sickness. The nurse will investigate sickness and ascertain if the cause was anything that endangers the welfare of fellow-pupils.

Although the idea of school nurse predominates in older communities, Tulsa is one of the leaders of the state in this activity.
