Lease of Valuable Oil Lands Figures in Corporation Lawyer's Interest.

WASHINGTON, Apr. 7.—In a somewhat lengthy letter, in which he wrongly surmises that the bill introduced by Congressman W. W. Hastings of Oklahoma would confer powers upon Superintendent Gabe E. Parker of the Five Civilized Tribes other than to pass upon matters affecting the individual welfare of the members of those bodies, Joseph H. Choate, octogenarian corporation lawyer, protests to Chairman John H. Stephens of the house Indian committee against the passage of the Hastings bill.

It is a matter of public record that the Indian office has been attempting to force a renewal of valuable oil leases in the Osage nation to certain corporations, including the Prairie Oil & Gas Co., a subsidiary of the Standard Oil company, upon terms which it is alleged would mean a financial loss of approximately \$10,000,000 to the Osages over an offer submitted to the Indian office a year ago by a group of independent oil refiners.

WASHINGTON, April 7.—Administration leaders in congress are hopeful the army increase bill, first of the three great national defense measures, will enter its final stage next week before the joint conference committee.
