HAMANN HAS REAL TEST FIGHT NOW

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Oct. 31.—Local fight fans are all worked up over Thursday night's 12-round battle between Freddy Hamann of San Francisco and Benny Chavez, rapid-fire Mexican featherweight of Trinidad. Col. Chavez and Hamann are among the best featherweights in the country today, both having won sensational battles in this vicinity. When local promoters went after this pair of sterling fighters it was quite a bidding affair. Convention hall promoters made an elaborate bid for the boys to settle their argument over the 15-round route, but on account of a weight handicap of several pounds in weight Chavez refused to meet the hard-hitting little conair star except over the 12-round route. Jimmy Hurst grabbed off the glove plan for the Academy Athletic club. The weight of the match was quite a stumbling block, and Chavez repeatedly refused to take a chance except at 124 pounds at the ringside. It grew to be a bitter argument between the boys and public sentiment of the fight fraternity forced Chavez to take a chance with the only boy that is conceded a chance to take his measure. They are boxing on a winner-take-all basis, and have posted big forfeits with a local stakeholder that neither boy will lift the scale beam over 124 pounds at the ringside.
