NEW PARKS WILL BE READY FOR SUMMER

City To Purchase Tract at South Main and 18th Street for Civic Center, Says Mayor.

"Tulsa is now the mecca city of the southwest—in a few months she will be known as the most beautiful city in the world," said Mayor C. H. Hubbard yesterday in discussing the civic improvements planned for the coming summer.

One of the prettiest natural spots in the city, located at the end of south Main street at the Eighteenth street intersection, a plot four and three-quarter acres in extent is being purchased for a city park...

Kendall addition is to have neither park, two sites, both located near the college are now being considered. This park will be at the disposal of citizens by the heated months of summer.

Howard Park, one of the most beautiful natural parks in the state, covering more than fourteen acres, and located on the street car line at West Tulsa is being trimmed, cleaned up and improved.

The colored addition has not been forgotten. Water mesquite trees, shrubbery and flowers may be well taken care of during the coming summer.

Riverside Boulevard, the lovely scenic drive skirting the Arkansas and eventually to completely encircle the city is now in the hands of construction. More than five miles of paving along the river front, 10 feet in width, and with a parking which is to be filled with closely trimmed grass, trees, shrubbery and flowers on either side, making the drive 75 feet in width is completed.

This drive in a year or two will be one of the beauty spots of the state.

The Owen Park conservatory is still flourishing and will be restocked, while the flowers in the remaining six parks of the city are being carefully tended and promise an abundance of blossoms.

Every resident of Tulsa and property owners in particular are urged by the mayor to take particular pride in keeping their own grass plots and door yards attractive, keeping the trees well trimmed and their parkings in good order.
