"A decided misunderstanding is reflected in the Faris press during the last two days regarding my projected trip to Herlin, which I subsequently abandoned," he said. "My object was to hurry, rather than to delay, the putting of the Versailles treaty into effect. NEW YORK, Dec. 25 .- The Christmas day celebration of the League for Amnesty for Political Prisoners met with disaster today when the police, soldlers and trate citizens broke it up. Several hundred men and women, placarded and In single file for the start of their "walk" up Fifth avenue, dwindled to about 50 persons, divided into two wandering bodies which found their ways "home" to the parish house of the Church of the Ascension in West Eleventh street after many hours of wanderings.

An all-day vigil at Trinity church downtown saw no demonstration there. Police warn-ings brought changes in the league's Christmas program, notable for omissions, it was said.
