

## LABOR ADOPTING BLACKLIST PLAN

Will Oppose Candidates Who Are Opposed to Claims.

## HELP BOTH PARTIES

Use Prohibitionists' Method in Coming Election to Elect Candidates.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25.—The national labor will adopt the successful political tactics of the "dry's" to put over its program and elect candidates for congress friendly to禁酒。

Like the prohibitionists, the American Federation of Labor, which is planning the most aggressive political campaign in its history, will work.

It will have a "black list" of enemies of labor running for re-election.

All democrats and republicans

long alike to us when they are against labor, in the new union political slogan.

In one district the candidate for congress known as being inimical to the interests of labor, is supported by the democratic party, the union leaders who concentrate their efforts to elect his republican opponents while both democratic and republican candidates are anti-labor, the union forces will try to form a coalition with some independent political movement favorable to its principles.

The federation will make "government by injunction" one of the issues in the next campaign. It will endeavor to get the political parties to denounce for congressional enactment to prevent the United States supreme court and other federal courts from passing on the constitutionality of laws passed by congress.

Another issue it will inject into the campaign will be the retention of the railroads by the government. It will urge the enactment of laws providing for the selection of federal judges by popular vote for a term of six years, demand deflation of currency and advocate the vesting control of the credits in a public agency.

The officers of the federation have been authorized by the executive council to "put into action" the declaration of labor's rights adopted by the labor conference a week ago.

A political committee may be appointed by the federation to conduct the campaign. There are plans for the raising of campaign funds by contributions from all the local and international unions affiliated with the federation.

## BODIES NOT YET FOUND

Search for Victims of Ill-Fated Oil Tanker Proves to Be FruITLESS.

BANDON, Ore., Dec. 25.—The waters of the Pacific have not yet yielded up the bodies of 22 of the crew of the ill-fated oil tanker J. A. Chandler, which went on the rocks off Cape Blanco near here last Thursday night. A steady patrol of the sand dunes and a constant search of the sea in these parts have proven fruitless.

The bodies of the four men washed up on the beach between this city and Blackpoint, is the only recovery made so far with the exception of the rescue of three men, including Captain Sawyer.

A hope has been abandoned, but effort will continue today and to-morrow.

The report that signs of life had been seen aboard the sunken portion of the ship was dispelled by Captain Johnson of the coast guard, who said it was only the flapping of a canvas on the bridge that had misled the beach guards.

## SEARCH IS MADE FOR NEW PLANET

Professor Pickering of Harvard Engaged on New Task.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Dec. 25.—Professor William H. Pickering of the Harvard astronomical observatory, who is stationed at Mandeville, Jamaica, is now engaged in a search for the planet which is supposed by astronomers to exist outside Neptune and to be the cause of the irregular motion of Uranus.

Professor Baile, director of Harvard Observatory, has suggested the existence of a planet outside Neptune for at least 50 years," Professor Bailey said, "and since 1857 many observers have tried to locate it. The usual method was to study the perturbations of Uranus and determine from these what must be the situation of the object which was deflecting Uranus from its course. In recent years, however, Professor Bailey has studied the perturbations of Neptune as well, and as a result has ascertained what he believes to be the approximate position of the new planet.

"He has recently been engaged in a systematic study of photographic plates of the area of the sky in

which he believes the planet to be situated at present. His method is to have telescope photographs of a certain small section of the heavens taken at short intervals, sometimes taken only a day apart, and by placing the plates one on top of another, to see if any of the minute points recorded on the plates seem to have moved. That is the safest method of conducting such a search.
