Veteran Merchant Dies After Two Weeks' Illness.

George T. Williamson, age 47, pioneer Tulsa merchant, died early yesterday morning at his home in the Wilshire neighborhood after an illness of two weeks. The funeral will be held from the home at 4 o'clock this afternoon. Mrs. Mable, wife of the late Christian pioneer, will officiate.

During the last 22 years, Mr. Williamson has been active in the building and industrial development of Tulsa. He was instrumental in building the first wagon bridge across the Arkansas river connecting the north part of the city with what was later named West Tulsa. He served as all-around business man in Tulsa.

At the time of his demise, Mr. Williamson was president of the Wright clothing company.
