

SUMMER STUNTS FOR Y. W. CAMP

Entertainments Planned for 125 Girls at Conference.

TO BE ANNUAL OUTING

Visitors From Oklahoma and Texas to Swim and Row at Parthenia Park.

A motor trip over Tulsa and a splash party in the Y. W. pool were among the good times planned by women members of the recreation, girls work and camp committees of the Tulsa association yesterday afternoon to entertain the 125 girls from Oklahoma and northern Texas who will gather at the Y. W. C. A. camp at Parthenia park in June time for an annual conference.

The recreation committee, of which Mrs. C. C. Simmons is chairman, will have charge of the transportation of the delegates to and from Tulsa and over the city. Mrs. May Hill was made chairman of the automobile committee.

To the girls work committee was assigned the securing of men life guards to be on duty at Parthenia park lake when conference delegates go swimming or boating. The girls will be allowed to swim or row in the lake only at a hedged bouge with guards on duty. They will be brought to the Tulsa association pool for one large swimming party.

Members of the camp committee of which Mrs. E. J. Davidson is chairman, will be responsible for getting such additional equipment as cots, mattresses, tents, chairs, dishes and silverware. Any organization, group or institution which is willing to lend such equipment for the period of the conference, June 8-13, will help greatly. About 26 tents are needed, including sleeping quarters. One auditorium tent, capable of seating about 300 people for use at large conference meetings, will be placed near the lodge.

It was announced yesterday that the 50 women in the three sections of the girls work committee will have their first joint meeting of the year together at the Y. W. C. A. camp Sunday, May 23, before the high school conference. The committee members will be taken to the camp in 10 or 13 cars provided for the occasion at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, May 23. There will be several talks on girls work during the meeting, which will close with the serving of tea in the lodge.

WANT TULSA UNIVERSITY

POLICE HUNT SLAYER

Chicago Police Link Murder of Jim Colosimo With Killing of Maurice Ehrlich in Labor War.

CHICAGO, May 12.—While the police sought today clues to the identity of the man who killed "Big Jim" Colosimo, proprietor of a restaurant in the old tenderloin quarter and known as the boss of the south side underworld, they linked the murder with the recent slaying of Maurice Ehrlich, labor leader and charged it to a gangland vendetta.

The state attorney's office asserted that Colosimo was the custodian of a fund of \$25,000 raised for the defense of Tim Murphy, Mike Carr and Vincenzo Cosimo, in connection with the murder of Ehrlich.

Diamonds and other jewelry valued at \$20,000 were found on Colosimo's body, eliminating robbery as a motive, the police believe. The diamonds were set in wrist buckles and suspenders, grips, chains of which were of finely woven gold.


