

CITY COMPLAINS TO PAVING FIRM

Says Company Draws Money on Estimates; Neglects Contracts

COMPANIES IN PROTEST

Say City Delivers Body Blow to Tulsa Industries With Such Attitudes

Mayer T. D. Evans and the city commissioners at their meeting yesterday took a stand against allowing estimates by the city engineer to paving companies before a substantial portion of their work is completed.

Apparently this decision was brought about through action of the Parker-Washington Paving company which, according to City Engineer C. E. Griggs, has already "overdrawn" its account with the city. Griggs requested the mayor and commissioners to instruct him not to use any more estimates.

Protests Lodged. William Fuller, representing the Parker-Washington company, and I. V. Gray, representing the Standard Paving company, which would also be affected by the decision, protested against the ruling on the ground that it would cause them financial embarrassment by seriously crippling their credit.

Fuller and Gray both declared that because of present stringent financial conditions, they are unable to secure the proper amount of money with which to carry on their work, and that they have completed much work which has not been used as collateral. They said it had been the custom in times past to allow these estimates from time to time.

Costly to Taxpayers. City Attorney Frank E. Duncan contended that the paving companies ask for an estimate as quickly as they have finished grading, and that after they have finished that part of their work they show no effort to finish the paving contract, causing property owners to pay 7 per cent interest for an indefinite period during which no work is done, interest starting when the first estimate is given.

"We are not trying to work a hardship on you," Street Commissioner O. A. Steiner declared, "we're only trying to force you to do something with these contracts now that you are obtaining some material."

Gray replied that the city's decision was a sledge-hammer blow at the paving companies, as they could not proceed unless they are able to obtain estimates.

While the present contracts specify that the city engineer "may" allow estimates, the city attorney insisted Tuesday that future contracts will specify that the engineer "cannot" allow estimates.

Woman's \$21,000 Gift May Admit Kendall to College Association

The only barrier between Kendall college and entrance into the North Central association of colleges has been removed by the recent addition to the endowment fund, according to President J. M. Gordon. The only requirement for admission into the North Central association which Kendall could not fill was that of an endowment of \$200,000. The gift of \$21,000 made last week by a Tulsa woman increased the endowment from \$188,549 to \$209,549.

Requirements for admission into the North Central association are high. Credits of schools affiliated with the association are accepted at the largest colleges and universities without entrance examinations.

NAVY WANTS MORE RECRUITS Several Thousand Former Service Men Needed For Cruise Starting Soon

Six destroyers attended by their mother ship and a flag ship will soon leave American shores for a year's cruise in European waters, according to officials at the local naval recruiting station. Several thousand men of various ratings are wanted for this cruise and the local station has been requested to wage a recruiting campaign to obtain the men.

Men who enlist for the cruise must have had service. They receive a furlough until October 15 but they must report at Philadelphia by that date, according to the recruiting officials. A weekly report of the number of men enlisted will be turned in by the officer in charge of the station and just as soon as the various quotas are reached the enlistment for the cruise will be shut down.
