J. Gray. The defendant was committed to jail under bond of \$100 for trial by district court.

Testimony showed that the driver of an American Railway Express wagon saw the negro take the package and run. Baker dropped the package when he found he was being pursued, but was arrested shortly after and placed in the county jail for trial.




