

## NEW AUTO RECORD FROM CITY MADE

Essex Car Establishes  
Still Another Feat  
on Saturday

GOES 54 MILES HOUR

From West Tulsa to Payne  
County Town Accomplished  
in 79½ Minutes

All motor car speed records from Tulsa to Cushing were broken Saturday morning by Perry York, secretary of the Tulsa Motor company, when he drove a stock Essex roadster the distance of 72½ miles in 79½ minutes, at an average speed of 54.5 miles per hour.

The run was made from the beginning of the paving at the north corner of the Texas company tank in Tulsa to the city limits of Cushing. A heavy, early morning fog, slippery roads and the usual heavy Saturday morning traffic on the highway made the race a hazardous and difficult undertaking, but all the more remarkable, because of these handicaps.

After lunching in Cushing, Mr. York and Harvey Stone, sporting editor of The American Saturday Night, the official timer for the run, drove the car back to Tulsa, where there was a crowd of local speed enthusiasts waiting to congratulate them.

The Essex also holds the local speed records from Tulsa to Collinsville, Tulsa to Oklahoma City and Tulsa to Sand Springs.

## TULSA TO GET PLANE

W. M. Graham to Leave For New York to Bring Back J-4, All-Metal Plane, for Work Here.

W. M. Graham, local oil man, expects to leave within the next few days for New York to obtain his new J-4 all-metal monoplane, which he purchased recently when Harry Larson and his party were in Tulsa en route to Los Angeles.

The machine purchased by Graham is a duplicate of the one which remained at the Curtis-Southwestern field here for two days, and in which a number of Tulsans were privileged to ride. It is a seven-passenger ship with all the conveniences of an enclosed automobile. A letter to The World from Larson stated that the J-4 which went through this city was delivered to an aviation company in Los Angeles on November 2.

Graham expects to use his new machine, which cost approximately \$10,000, for both business and pleasure.

## DAMAGE CLAIMS PRESENTED
