Prisoners by Mexican  
Fiscal Guards

**PUT IN NOGALES JAIL**

Finally Paroled With Orders  
to Appear in Court for  
Hearing This Morning

NOGALES, Ariz., Dec. 30.—A party of five American soldiers, under command of Lieut. H. H. Luther of the topographic department of the army were taken into custody at Nogales, Sonora, and brought to Nogales, Sonora, today by a party of Mexican fiscal guards when they motored across the international boundary line into Mexico. The soldiers were said to have been seeking water.

The prisoners were brought to Nogales where they were held for several hours in the municipal jail, pending a conference between American Consul Francis E. Dyer, Mexican Consul Monteverde and Lieut. Scott Israel, army intelligence officer. They were released on parole with instructions to report in the morning to Mexican immigration officers, pending an answer to a wire sent to Secretary of War Cates at Mexico City for advice. Mexican and American consular and immigration authorities expressed the opinion that the incident was based on technical grounds. The Mexican officer in command of the detachment which took the American soldiers into custody, stated the reason he detained them was that they brought their firearms across the border into Mexico.

**Car Demolished, 2 Hurt  
in Freak Auto Accident**

According to reports filed at police headquarters yesterday morning, P. J. Weir, 37 years old, 11 West Sixth, was the victim of a "freakish" street car-automobile accident Wednesday night. Weir says that about 9 o'clock he was driving a Dodge touring car, west on Fourth street, as he crossed Main a south bound street car struck the auto squarely amidships. The auto was pushed down the street about 175 feet where a north bound street car on the other track struck it. Here both street cars came to a stop. Result—the Dodge was demolished. Weir suffered an injured left leg, and his wife, who was also in the front seat, suffered slight injuries. A small child riding in Mrs. Weir's lap was uninjured.

**SAND SPRINGS WANTS COPS**

Need More Lights and Policemen to


