

PAVING MATERIAL UP TO TAXPAYERS

Irving Place Folks to Be
Asked to State Their
Views

Hearing on March 18 Will De-
cide Which of Two Types
Is Best Suited

That property owners in New Irving Place, Overlook Park and other additions may have an opportunity to express their desires regarding paving, city officials have announced that a hearing will be held in connection with the regular commission meeting Friday, March 18, at which persons interested may air their views.

If a majority favor the proposed concrete base and fibrolithic surfacing, it should be made known at this hearing, City Auditor Mrs. Frank Seaman said Friday, no the necessary resolution may be published with the assurance that there will be no protests.

Want Public Expression.
Heretofore resolutions have been published at a considerable cost, she said, and later the property owners have appeared to judge vigorous protest which prevented paving from proceeding and made the publication for an unnecessary expense.

The streets included in the paving district created in the northwest part of the city are:

Xenophon avenue from the north line of Brady to the south line of Easton; Waco avenue from the north line of the Katy right-of-way to the south line of Duval; Vancouver avenue from the north line of the Katy right-of-way to the south line of Easton, except intersection with Cameron; Union avenue from the north line of the Katy right-of-way to the south line of Easton; Xenophon to the east line of Waco; Cameron from the east line of Xenophon to the east line of Waco; Cameron from the east line of Waco to the east line of Union; Union avenue to the west line of Union.
