

## CABRERA'S SON ASKS FOR HELP

Appeals to U. S. Legion's  
Head to Aid in Get-  
ting Father Free

## WILSON IS ATTACKED

The Former Administration Is  
Charged With Bad Faith in  
Treating Republic

WASHINGTON, April 4.—Manuel  
Cabrera, son of Estrada  
Cabrera, former president of Guate-  
malan, who is in prison in Guate-  
malan, today appealed to the Amer-  
ican Legion to support him in his  
efforts to gain his father's free-  
dom.

Stated as Political Prisoner.  
In a long telegram to Colonel F.  
W. Caldwell, commander-in-chief  
of the legion, the young man pointed  
out that the Guatemalan republic  
was the first in Central America to  
follow the United States into the  
great war. Today "Manuel" is a  
political prisoner actually in the custody  
of a minor war who is an ex-  
German soldier.

Accuses Wilson of Bad Faith.  
Young Cabrera virtually accused  
the Wilson administration of bad  
faith in refusing to take active steps  
to bring about the release of the  
president, who he stated was im-  
prisoned as a result of the  
"wanton violation of a solemn pact  
entered into under the protection of  
the American flag," he stated he is  
hopeful that President Harding and  
Secretary Hughes will prove more  
sympathetic and asked that the  
legion lend its support because of  
the old Cabrera gave the allies during  
the war.

President Cabrera, the telegram  
stated, was overthrown through  
treachery inspired by the German  
state owners whose properties he  
had seized pursuant to the sugges-  
tion of President Wilson. "In spite  
of a formal capitulation guaranteeing  
the safety and the inviolability  
of his property, suggested by and  
drawn and signed in the American  
legation in the presence of the  
American minister," the telegram  
continues, "he was nevertheless, not  
only thrust into dungeon in the  
common jail, but also robbed of  
everything he possessed."

## PAID ASSASSINS BACK OUT

And Spinster Who Hired Them to  
Kill Her Husband Arrested.

BASEL, Switzerland, April 4.—  
Two men who had entered into a  
contract with a woman to end her  
life, were recently haled into criminal  
court here by the party of the  
second part for taking her money  
and failing to carry out their bar-  
gain. Robbery was charged and the  
men were sentenced to terms  
in prison. The woman narrowly  
escaped trial for attempted self-mur-  
der.

Fraulein Krauss had been brood-  
ing over her spinsterhood, but could  
not bring herself to commit suicide.  
She found a chemist, who professed  
to be willing to act as executioner  
for a consideration.  
The woman insisted upon being  
beheaded. It was alleged, but the  
chemist held that poison would be  
just as efficacious and more con-  
ventional. The third party in the  
negotiations suggested drowning as  
a compromise and the deal was  
closed.

The three started for the lake  
Lucerne, but the chemist, having  
exact advance payment of 75 per  
cent of the \$400 contract price, van-  
ished en route.

## Alleged Poisoner of Sweetheart Says He Tried to Save Life

CORUNNA, Mich., April 4.—  
Forest Higgins, charged with the  
murder of his sweetheart, Lucy  
Whitman, 19 years old, a farmer's  
daughter, will waive his constitu-  
tional right and testify at the in-  
quest into the girl's death at  
Durand tomorrow morning. A. L.  
Chandler of Owosso, attorney for  
Higgins, announced this after-  
noon.

"I have told all I know about  
the case already and have nothing  
to conceal," Higgins is quoted as  
having said to the authorities.

Higgins will be arraigned on  
the murder charge before Jus-  
tice Samuel Patchell at Durand  
tomorrow, shortly before the in-  
quest. He is alleged by the of-  
ficers to have persuaded the  
Whitman girl to take poison.

Higgins denies this, declaring he made  
an ineffectual attempt to pre-  
vent the girl from taking the  
poison.

The funeral of the girl was  
held this afternoon at the home  
of her parents near Durand. A  
large number of neighbors at-  
tended. The body was buried.

Officers announced it might be  
exhumed later for further exami-  
nation.

## U. S. Grand Jury on Job.

MUSKOGEE, April 4.—Twenty  
grand jurors from all over eastern  
Oklahoma were sworn in this  
morning to pass on nearly 300 federal  
cases. Judge R. L. Williams gave  
the jurors no special charges, as all  
are the ordinary run of federal busi-  
ness—liquor, narcotic, banking, li-  
cense, shipment, larceny, postal  
laws. W. D. Breidlove of Muldrow  
was named foreman of the jury,  
which is expected to finish its delib-  
erations within a week or ten days.

While the grand jury was getting  
under way, Judge Williams heard  
the April motions, listened to pleas  
and got started on the short civil  
docket. Oliver Heath of Sapulpa  
drew the only prison sentence—a  
year and a day in Leavenworth for  
larceny of two suits of clothes from  
the Frisco railroad.

"You've been in prison twice be-  
fore, so it's no disgrace for you to  
go to Leavenworth," commented the  
judge, "otherwise I might send you  
to jail, as its not a serious offense."

A fine of \$100 also was imposed,  
but will not be collected. Heath  
also was charged with larceny of

missed after he pleaded guilty in the

## Durant Bank Robbed Thrice in 3 Months by Pickax Bandits

DURANT, Okla., April 4.—The  
First State bank of Durant, Okla.,  
near here, was robbed early this  
morning of a few hundred dol-  
lars in Liberty bonds, the exact  
amount not yet determined by  
bank officials, according to word  
received here late today. The rob-  
bers gained entrance to the bank  
and pickaxe, the officials stated.  
This is the third time in three  
months the bank has been robbed.

## PASSPORT RULE IS LIFTED

United States No Longer Requires  
Passports at Entrance or Exit.

WASHINGTON, April 4.—The  
United States no longer requires  
passports for American citizens  
leaving or entering the country, or  
for aliens leaving the country, the  
state department announced today.

The new ruling of the state de-  
partment is based upon an opinion  
by the attorney general that the  
passport control law was repealed  
by the resolution passed by congress  
terminating certain war legisla-  
tion.

The state department points out,  
however, that American citizens who  
are going to foreign countries should  
determine whether a valid passport  
is required in order to enter that  
country.
