

KRAMER FAVORS BEER AND WINES

Case Lots Could Be Sold by Pharmacists Only, His Recommendation

WASHINGTON, April 9.—Beer and wine, bottled in case lots, will be sold by pharmacists exclusively and no sales by brewers or distillers will be allowed by the government, if recommendations of Prohibition Commissioner Kramer are approved. Commissioner Kramer also seeks to incorporate in a draft of proposed regulations, dealing with beer and wine sales, provisions which will increase the responsibility of physicians prescribing for their patients and druggists making sales.

The right of dry law officials to limit the amount of beer and wine prescribed in a given period for patients still remains a point of extreme doubt among the treasury legal advisers.

Kramer said that he had been advised that physicians in the Pacific coast prescribe as much as 19 cases of wine, but he believes the limits now suggested will not impose unreasonable limitations. The stricter proposal, however, will not stand if the new revenue commissioner adopts a policy in strict conformity to the Palmer decision.
