#### Baby Boy Left at Nursery Offered Big Choice of Foster Parents

The brown-eyed little boy who is looking for a home has become a baby of mystery. And he needs a home more than ever. The mother who first said that this is a cold, cold world should have been able to see that would through the eyes of that chubby baby. Each a perspective would have changed that view entirely. For it is in a cold world as it is to him, but a world full of wanting and warm hearts.

The mystery baby is in a Tulsa home now, with a woman who wants a lot to be his mother. There is another woman who wants to mother him just as badly, and she is waiting with open arms to see the present arrangement prove satisfactory. It is a very good thing, perhaps, that he is wanted by so many people, because his mother has vanished. The patient-faced woman who told her story with a dumb look of suffering in her eyes took the baby to the day nursery just after visiting the humane society of the city and left him. She never came back for him.

The other day The World carried a story about a mother who wanted to give her little boy away if she could find a good home for him in order that he might have the right

kind of advantage. The case was taken up by the humane society. The day following Mrs. E. L. McConell, one of the office workers, who had taken a personal interest in the mother and her baby, was swamped with telephone calls. People from Jennings, Okmulgee, Sapulpa, Collinsville, Claremore and Highport as well as Tulsa called up to tell Mrs. McConell that they wanted to make room for the homeless and nearly motherless little youngster.

It wasn't long until he really was motherless. Mrs. McConell had told her that she could leave her baby at the day nursery while she worked. So the next morning she took her small boy to the nursery. Ever since then the mother didn't appear. Yesterday the baby went with his real mother to see how he likes his new home.

Meanwhile the humane society is wondering what has become of the mother.
