"Just what do you mean by that?" I inquired.

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
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Planes Crash 4,000 Feet in Air

When Rose "Fatty" Arbuckle entered court today for the fourth session of his trial, which is expected to see the completion of the jury that will hear the evidence against him, he just missed meeting face to face Diamantina Maude Delmont, who swore to the murder complaint, later reduced to manslaughter, on which he is now being tried.

Mrs. Delmont, friend of Virginia Gappe, was not called as a witness at the preliminary trial. Today she visited District Attorney Brady's office, arriving just before Arbuckle passed down the corridor to the courtroom.

It was learned that following the conference Mrs. Delmont was served with a state subpoena to appear as a witness at the trial. This was regarded as a startling development, as up until today District Attorney Brady had insisted he would not call her to the stand.

Additional delay in completing the Arbuckle jury was made probable this afternoon when it became known the state had decided to ask for the selection of the thirteenth or alternate juror, provided for by the laws of California to sit in the event of illness of any juror of the original 12.

It also is understood a motion will be made to have the jury locked up for the duration of the trial.

For the first time in two days the trial had a full house today. Arbuckle appeared in a jovial mood as the work of selecting a jury seemed nearing an end.

He wore a blue suit today and a 1922 Red Cross roll call button was prominent on the lapel of his coat.

OPEN GERMAN CONSULATE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17.—American consular agencies will be established in Germany at once, in accordance with the action of this government in reopening diplomatic relations with Germany.

Appointment of Elms Loring Dress, as charge d'affaires at Berlin, is but temporary, it was stated, and he will hold office only until the appointment of an ambassador.

MEMORIAL NEARLY FINISHED

Civic Organizations Will Finance Furnishing of Hospital.

Special to The World. HARTLEBURG, Nov. 17.—The Washington county \$200,000 memorial hospital will be completed and ready for occupancy by January 1, according to word given out by superintendent Bowen of the Shallenburger Construction company, the Tulsa concern that is erecting the building.

All of the brick work has been completed and the terrazzo work on the three floors is now nearly finished.

The marble work for the interior decorating is on the ground and the elevator company will move its material on the ground this week.

Various civic organizations of Bartlesville and Washington county have pledged the money to furnish the 48 floors in the building and this money is now being paid into the committee having in charge the task of purchasing the interior fixtures.


