Took Poison by Mistake. MUSKOGEE.—Dr. W. G. Tilley of Locust Grove was found dead Saturday night in his room at a local hotel. Death had been caused by drinking poison. A note written on a prescription blank said: "I have taken carbole acid by mistake."

Killing Was Justified. ADA.—Charles Dugan was released Saturday by justice of the peace court on preliminary trial on a charge of murder. It was explained that Dugan was justified in killing George McNutt at Tulsa on December 4. Evidence produced shows that McNutt had threatened Dugan's life and that Dugan had tried to avoid him.

City Electric Light Plant. TABLEQUAH, Dec. 19.—The several families of full-blooded Cherokee who made the long and rugged trip from the Delaware district to a place down in the hills of Chickson township are apparently pleased with their new location. When the Indians removed from Delaware it was stated that they had departed for their promised land, but no one hereabouts could tell who had promised them the land.

Noted however, it is "norated" that Tax Ballard, a well known citizen of the Greenleaf country, may have promised to some extent, as it is related that he has a large acreage and has been in favor of Indian settlers establishing themselves thereon for some time—for a number of moons, in fact. The recent news along the Greenleaf creek in a region which is to considerable extent primeval at least when compared with other portions of northeastern Oklahoma. The streams produce some fish and the soil is gray siltstone grass and ripen to perfection.

AGED MAN HAS BAD FALL. Slipped From Hayloft and Struck the Ground on His Head. TABLEQUAH, Dec. 19.—James A. King, one of the old citizens of this place, received serious injuries at his country home Wednesday night. Mr. King went to his barn with several children to capture some small birds, large numbers of which roosted in the barn. GET \$1,147 PER CAPITA

Indians Get Money From Lease Sales as Well as Royalty. PAIRFAX, Dec. 19.—The 2,229 Okla. allottees in Okage county were made happy last week by receiving their quarterly payments which amounted to \$1,147 per capita. Half of this money was their one-sixth royalty on the amount of oil produced and the other half was bonus money received from lease sales.

The total payment amounted to almost a quarter of a million dollars. These older citizens of the county can well remember when the regular quarterly payment amounted to only about \$60 per head.
