

REPORT DAYLIGHT ROBBERY OF SILKS

Lingerie, Jewelry, Beads Valued in Excess of \$2,000 Taken

Silken goods and jewelry thought to exceed \$2,000 in value were stolen in one of the most daring daylight robberies reported to the police for many years. E. A. Dumit, proprietor of the Oriental shop, 10 East fifth street, was held up and robbed by a negro hijacker early Wednesday morning, the negro locking him in a closet and escaping with the goods, which were taken from the shelves, according to Dumit's story to the police.

THE TURNING POINT

Thinks Pittsburg County Has Now Reached the Place Where Progress Is Up-Grade.

MALESTER, March 22.—Judging from the building activities in McAlester and Pittsburg county this section has reached the turn of the lane and has struck a rapid pace on the up-grade. In addition to a quarter million dollar waterworks dam and reservoir being constructed at Bull Creek, about eight and one-half miles north of the city, two new sewer disposal plants are just being completed. One of these is on the northeast and the other southwest of the city, the one on the southwest having just been completed. The disposal plants are of the Imhoff tank variety and are expected to provide ample disposal for several years. The plants are being constructed so that additional units can be added when the needs of the city demand. A bond issue of \$50,000 was voted to take care of the sewer disposal. The present contracts call for about \$33,000.

ENGINEERS HEARD BY WATER BOARD

Bids on Spavinaw Project Presented for Consideration

Hearing of bids on the engineering supervision and construction of the Spavinaw water project kept the city nonpartisan water board in all-day session on Wednesday in the municipal hall. The representative of each firm was given a separate and private hearing, when he presented a proposition in detail and with full paraphernalia of statement and maps answered questions of water board members. Yesterday marked only a beginning of the hearing, which will be continued at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon. Propositions will be filed for the consideration of the board members and for reference. Among those heard yesterday were Col. George Goethals of New York, who presented two propositions and who left for home last night to prepare a third for presentation next Tuesday. The bid of Black & Beach of Kansas City was made by Brown and Hastings of the firm and others heard were Wynn Meredith of Sanderson and Porter of San Francisco, J. L. Harrington of a Kansas City firm of which he is a member, and L. R. Houston of Alford & Burdick of Chicago.

MAKE RAIDS ON BOOTLEGGERS

Two Kansas Men Arrested and Lodged in Newkirk Jail.

Special to The World. BLACKWELL, March 22.—Chief of Police Van Cleave is determined that bootleggers cannot come to Blackwell and get away. Saturday night he caught two men from Wichita, Kan., with five gallons of whiskey and a car. The men gave their names as Felix Orth and Isaac Mars. The men were sent to the Newkirk jail and the car was attached and held to be forfeited to the state. This is the third raid the chief has made in the last week, and he and his deputies are going to see that none come here and get away with it, he said.

LIGHT VOTE AT THE PRIMARY

Contest for Street Commissioner Arouses Little Interest.

Special to The World. BARTLESVILLE, March 22.—J. M. Leonard, democrat, and John O. Crane, republican, were the successful candidates in the party primary held here Tuesday for the office of city commissioner of streets and public improvements. Leonard received 144 of 207 democratic votes cast, his only opponent, H. M. Hower, receiving 43 votes. Crane got 129 out of the total of 208 republican votes, the remainder of the votes being divided among his three opponents as follows: Carlton J. Mitchell, 52; Deibert, 41. The total vote cast was about one-third of the normal vote at an off year election, being 416 ballots.

No Arrests in Etheridge Case. DALLAS, Texas, March 22.—After an investigation of almost thirty-six hours by authorities no arrests have been made in connection with the kidnaping of F. H. Etheridge, a Dallas lumberman, who was abducted Monday night from his home by a gang of unmasked white men, taken to the river bottoms, handcuffed to a tree, stripped to the waist and cruelly flogged. Detectives working on the case declined this morning to say whether they are in possession of clues expected to lead to an early arrest.

Mallot store, in which the postoffice is located, was wrecked. The bandits escaped with \$10, the contents of the safe, in a car stolen from S. L. Baker, grocer. The car was recovered this afternoon at Preemption, Ill., 40 miles away.
