Business Better This Year Than in Summer of 1921

Admitting the facts that the heat is no incentive to business, that a big per cent of the business offices are partially deserted by vacationists, that there has been an unwelcome influx of tourists, and that there is much of business in August and July anyway, the truth still stands that business generally is much better now than it was at this time last year. This is true in virtually all lines of business.

The oil cuts have failed to depress the general public as they would once have done. They are regarded as but a passing phase and a change in oil prices will not affect the expected results. The coal shortage is bound to mean that large quantities of fuel oil will be shipped and this will inevitably react upon and strengthen the oil industry in general, forcing higher prices. This is the resume of the situation made by Earl F. Hicks, superintendent of Bradstreet's office here in Tulsa in his weekly report made to the New York office.

Condition Relieved.

"Gasoline demand is heavy," said Hicks, "and refineries are very busy. Oil operators are using every means to reduce production. With the coal shortage large quantities of fuel oil will be shipped; this is expected to strengthen the oil industry in general, forcing higher prices. Large quantities of strip coal are being mined in Craig county, Oklahoma and other parts of the state. This will relieve the coal situation in near-by states."

The consistent carrying out of the extensive paving program here in Tulsa has a strengthening effect upon the general business situation and the fact that large numbers of permits are issued for the building of modestly priced homes is an unmistakable indication of the trend of the times. Slowly but surely the city is extending its limits and home builders are going further and further out into the suburbs of the town. One real estate man has heard to say last week that virtually all of their business recently has been the sale of lots upon which homes are to be built in the outer edges of the city, and immediate construction of homes upon them was contemplated. This would indicate that there is to be no slackening in the building program, and that home construction is to continue into 1923 in a larger measure perhaps than it has done heretofore. Apartment houses are going up and more are being planned for by builders with the view of taking care of the constant influx of people and the prevention of a repetition of the shortage of homes that resulted not so long ago in the skyrocketing of rentals.

Record Breaking Event.

The record breaking event for the Mayas hotel at the corner of Fifth and Cheyenne last week was something of an epoch-making event in the history of the city of Tulsa. The Mayas brothers, whose name the hotel will bear and who are in the main
