### FIREMAN KILLED IN WRECK


Baltimore and Ohio Engine Derailed by Pipe Dropped From Auto. WEST NEWTON, Pa., Oct. 23.—One man, fireman of the train, was killed and a score of passengers injured when the Charleston, Pittsburgh and Ohio railroad was wrecked at Haverhill, near here just before noon today. 2,500 Workers in Liverpool, Ohio, to Walk Out on October 31. EAST LIVERPOOL, Ohio, Oct. 23.—According to authentic reports from here today, a strike of 2,500 workers in sanitary potteries throughout the United States is to come effective October 31, has been ordered in a referendum vote conducted by the National Brotherhood of Operative Potters. The walkout will mean paralysis of the crockery industry, for 17,000 general ware workers have been on strike since September 30.

In its opinion, the supreme court
