The contract for supplying the Jamestown asylum with dry goods for the ensuing year has been awarded to Sam Blank of Valley City. The yearly expenditure for this purpose amounts to about \$5,500.

The coroner's jury at Blanchard decided that the Finlander, Lane, whose dead body was discovered in a ditch near that town, had been murdered, but was unable to determine in what manner or by whom the crime was committed.

SECRET HISTORY. How France Escaped a German Alliance During Fashoda Excitement. Metienne Lamy is doing his tactless best, through a series of articles in the Belair of Paris, to solidify the Anglo-French entente by removing the last disturbing taint of the Fashoda fiasco of 1898.

He currently states that when the meeting of Kitchener with the Anglo-Egyptian forces and the expedition of Commandant Marchand occurred the German Ambassador in Paris suggested to M. Hanotaux, then French Foreign Minister, a Franco-German entente having for its primary object the protection of the Egyptian independence against English encroachment.

While M. Hanotaux was coquetting with the proposal the Melino Ministry, of which he was a member, fell. On the day that he left the Quai d'Orsay M. Hanotaux wrote a confidential Ministerial minute on the subject of the German proposal, leaving it to his successor to come to a decision in the matter.

Then came the Brisson Ministry, with M. Delcasse, and the possibility of an alliance with Germany was lost. Germany was told that she could not count on French help in an expedition against England.

If France, says the writer, had cooperated with Germany at the moment when England was troubled by Menelik in Abyssinia and Kruger in the Transvaal she would certainly have gained what she has now irrevocably lost, as England would at that moment have submitted to a compromise rather than run the risk of a war which might have imperiled her supremacy.

For his conduct during the crises in question M. Lamy soundly rates M. Delcasse, who, he says, either committed an act of folly or a serious crime. When the British demanded the evacuation of Fashoda, M. Delcasse naturally wished to await the arrival of Lieutenant Baratier, who was bringing news from Marchand, but Lord Salisbury pressed for Fashoda or war. M. Delcasse yielded, and three days before the arrival of Marchand's envoy Fashoda was surrendered away, at a time when its possession would have been invaluable to France.—New York Times.
