Colon, Panama, Visited Early This Morning—Kerosene Stock in Danger.



From All Parts of the United States Take Possession of St. Paul for Convention of Federation of Women's Clubs.

CORDIALLY WELCOMED BY GOVERNOR JOHNSON

And Officials—"Battle Hymn of the Republic" Sung in Opening Meeting.

St. Paul, Minn., May 30.—Women from all parts of the United States are arriving in St. Paul today, their shirtwaist fronts gaily decorated with badges of all colors showing that they are delegates and officers of the general federation of women's clubs which will begin a week's convention here tonight.

The first meeting in connection with this event was held at the Ryan hotel this forenoon where General President Mrs. Sarah Platt has declared her quarters and where she met the board of directors.

The formal opening of the convention will take place tonight at the national guard armory at the corner of Sixth and Exchange streets where all meetings will be held. This meeting will consist altogether of addresses of welcome. Miss Margaret J. Evans, dean of the woman's department of Carlton college, will deliver the invocation.

THE REVOLUTIONISTS CLAIM DECIDED VICTORY


Toledo Marching Into Guatemala With Many Troops—Ocos Stormed.
